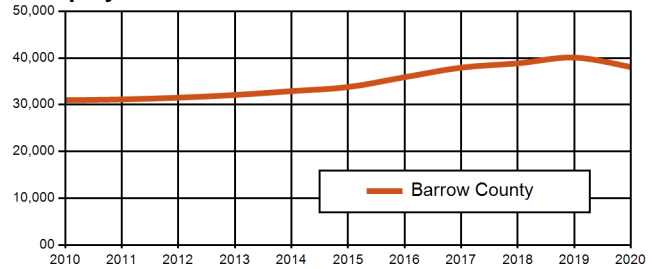

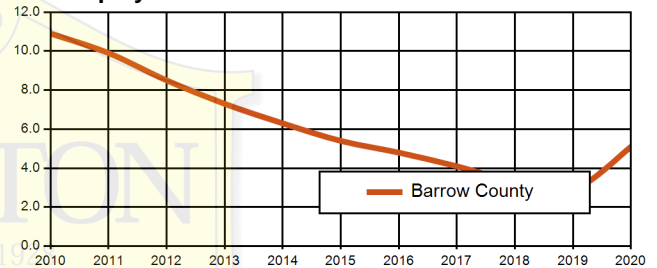

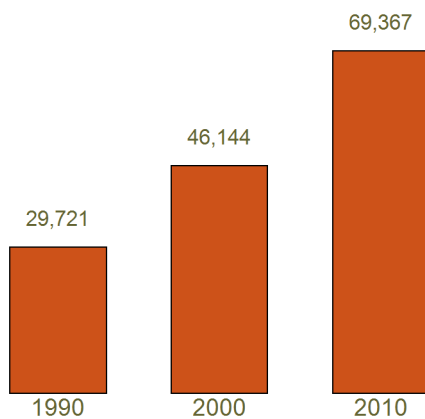
Employment Trends

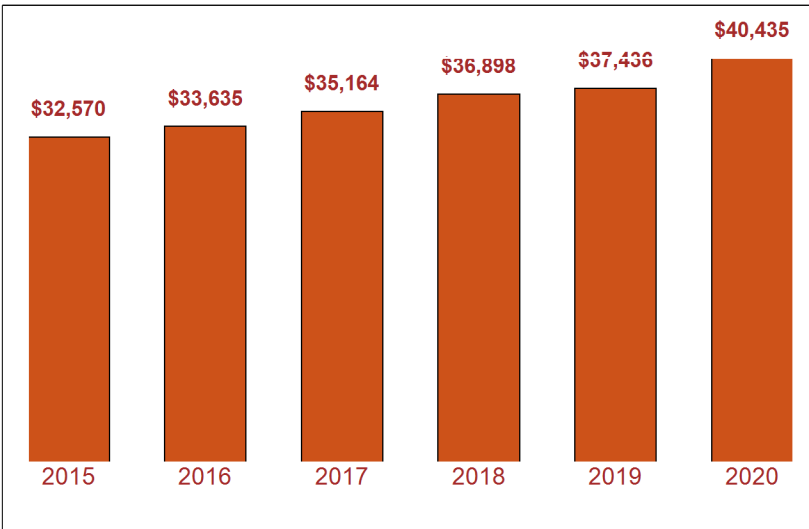

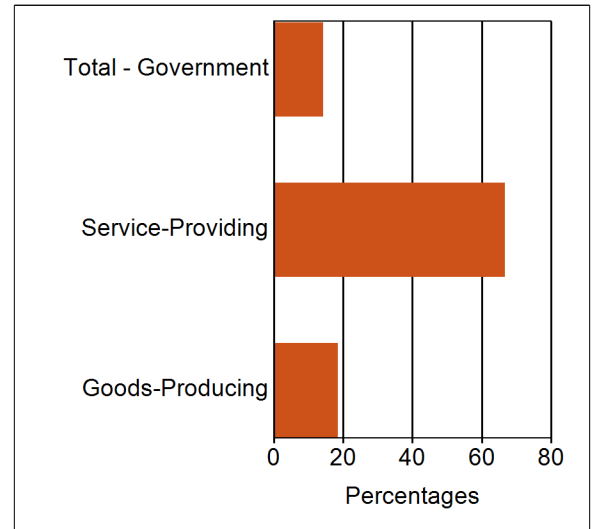
Barrow Per Capita Income
