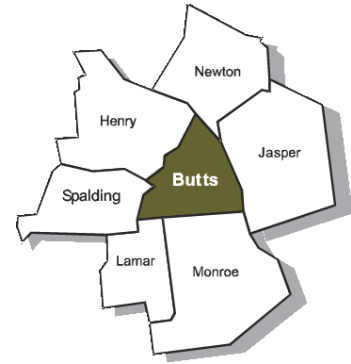

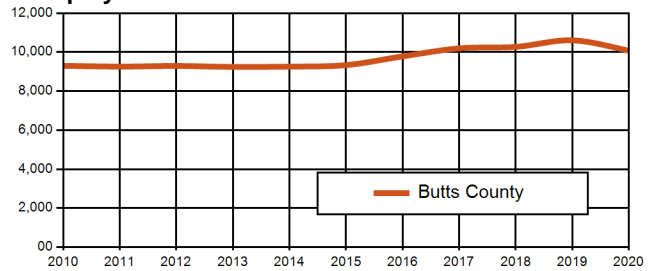

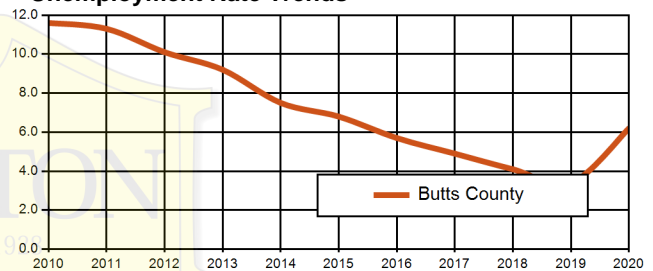

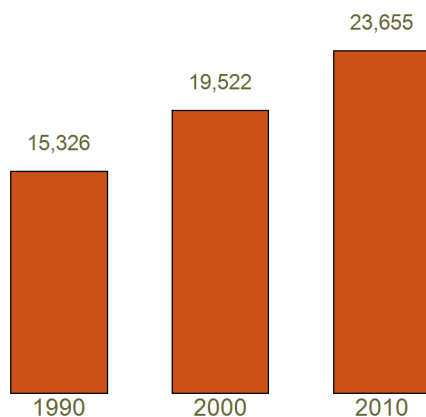
Unemployment Rate Trends

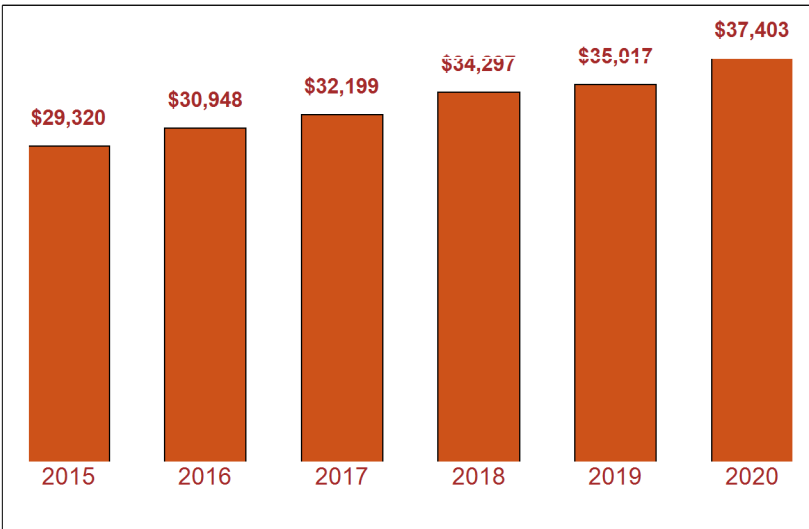

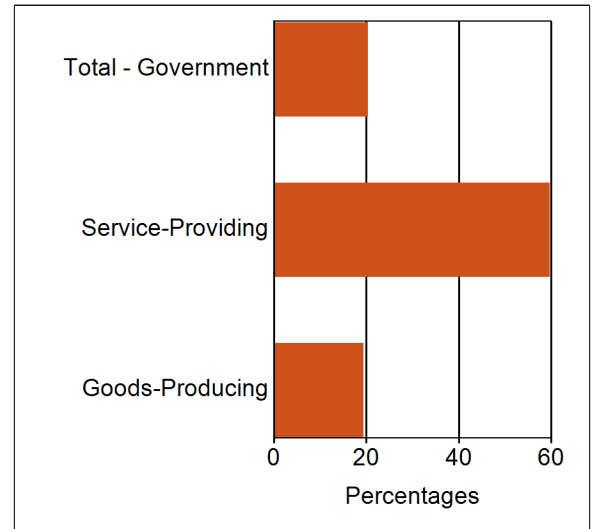
## Butts Per Capita Income

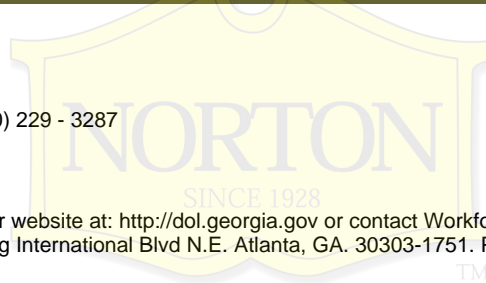
