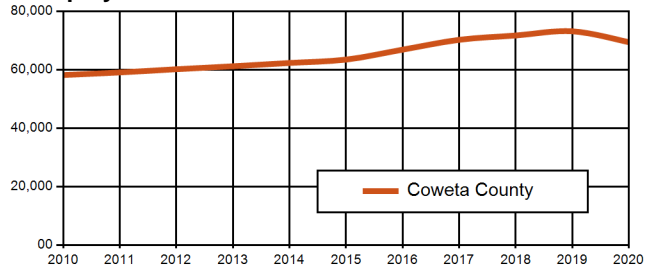

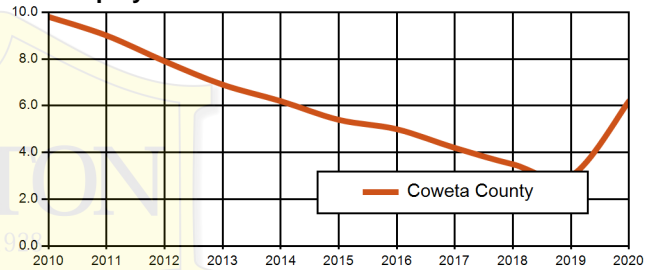

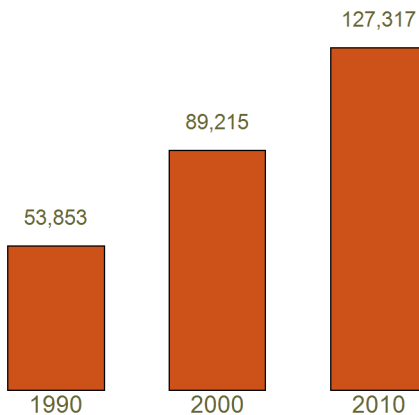
Unemployment Rate Trends

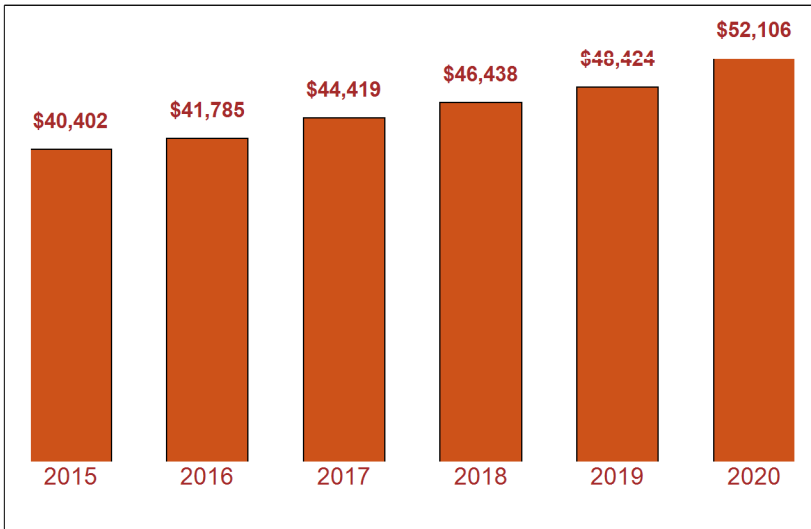

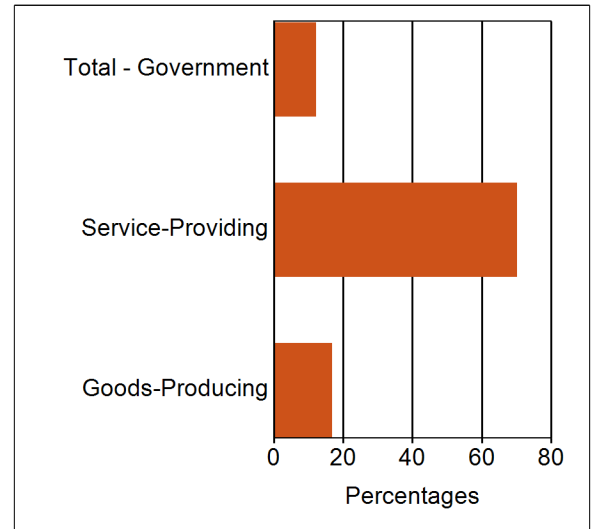
Coweta Per Capita Income
