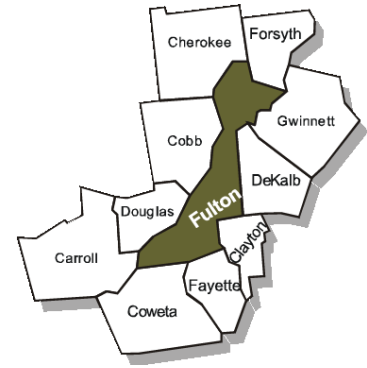

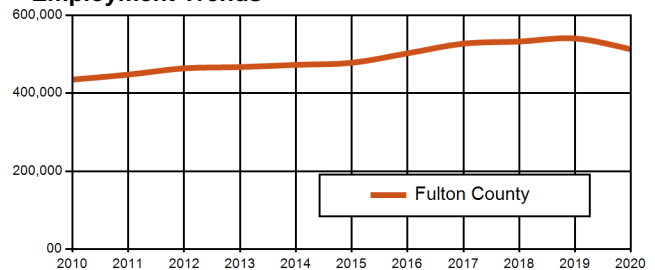

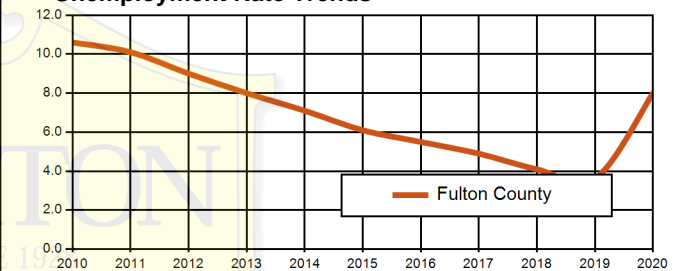

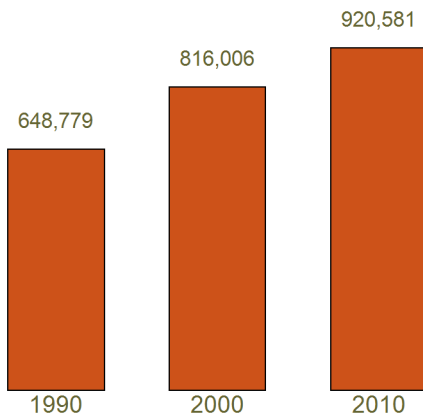
Unemployment Rate Trends

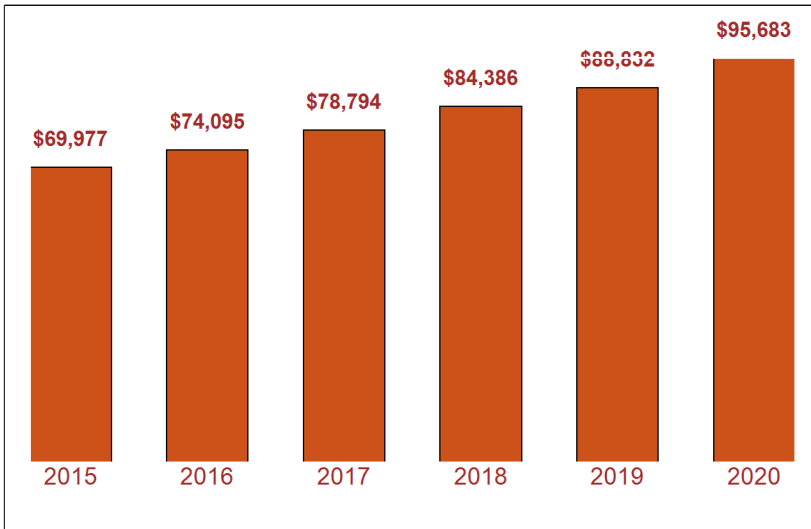

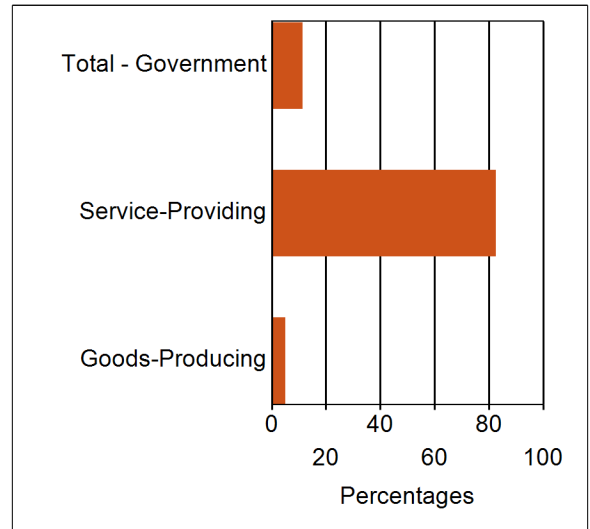
## Fulton Per Capita Income
