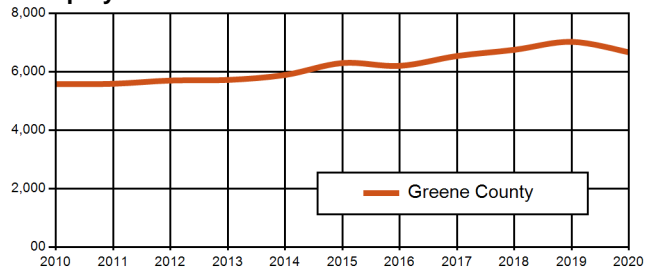

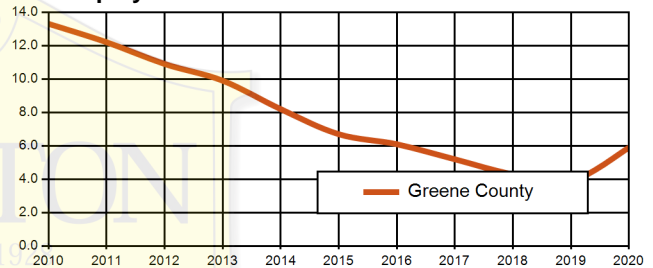

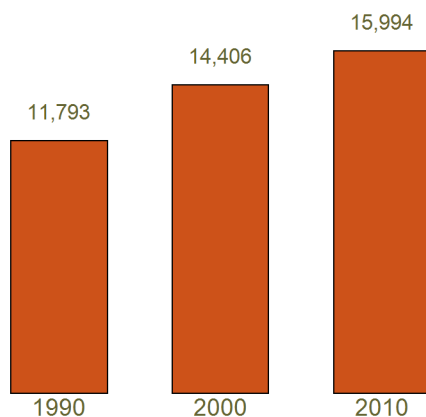
#### Unemployment Rate Trends

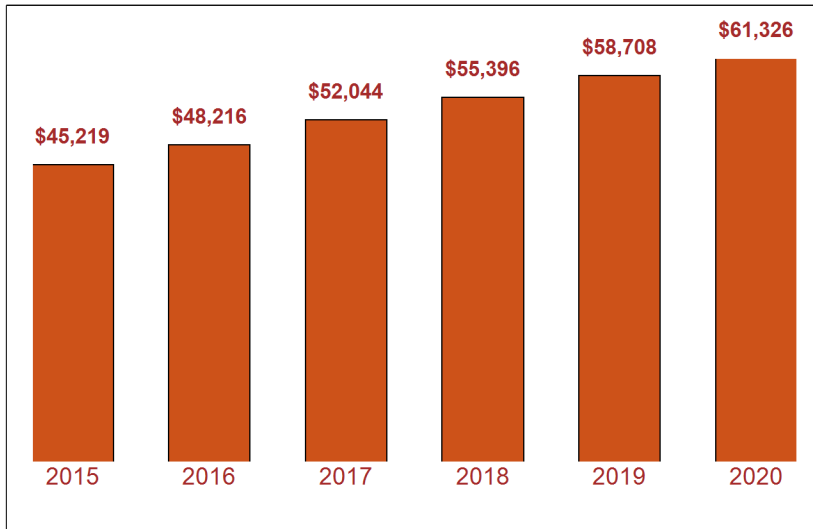

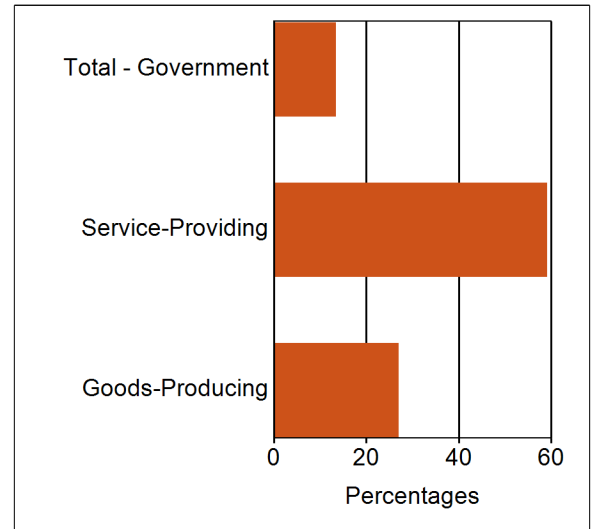
## Greene Per Capita Income

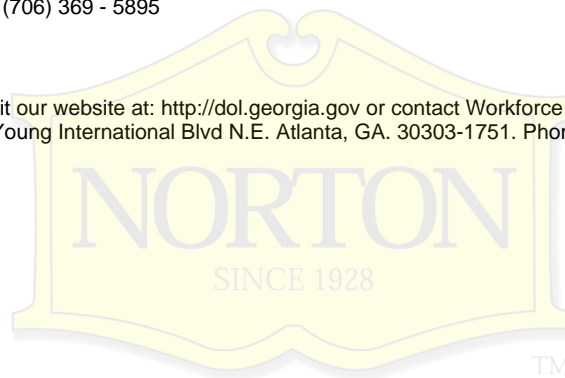
