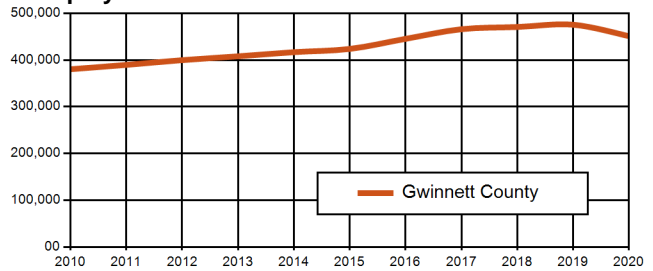

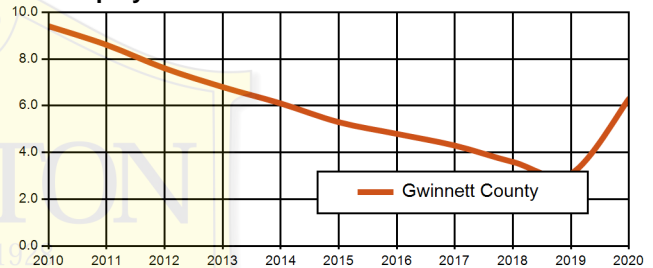

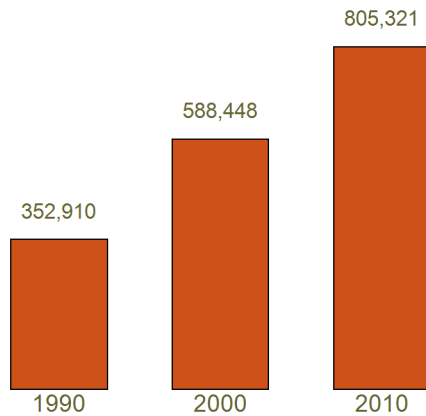
Unemployment Rate Trends

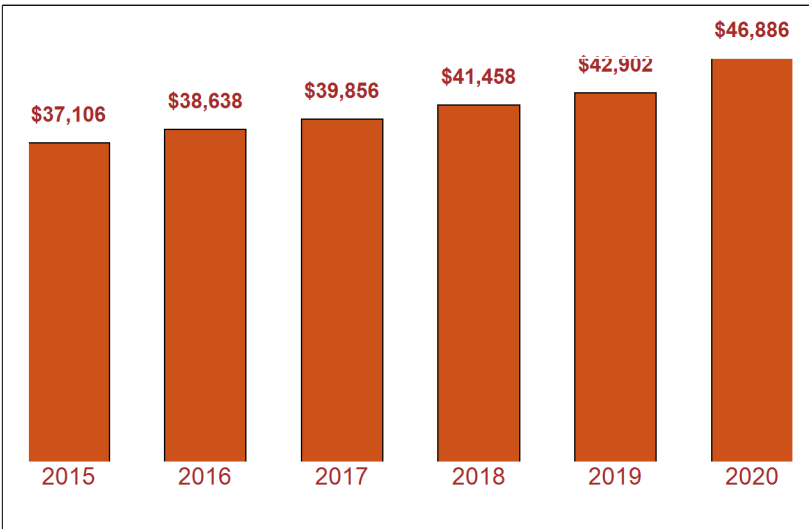

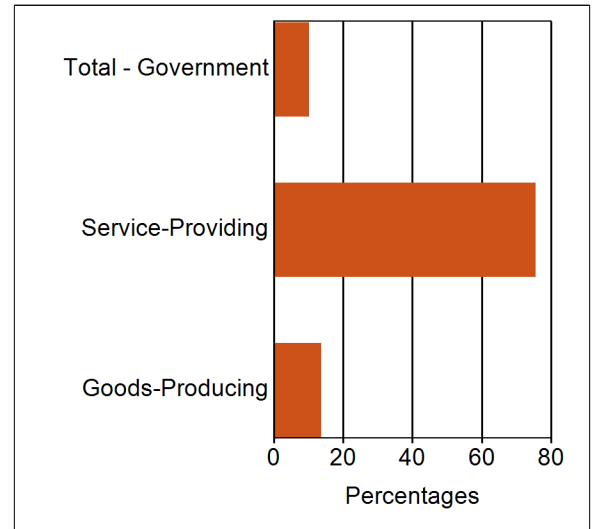
Gwinnett Per Capita Income
