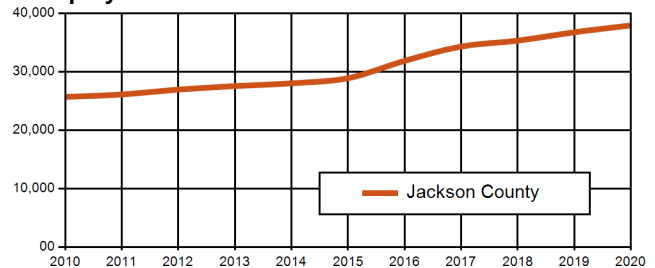

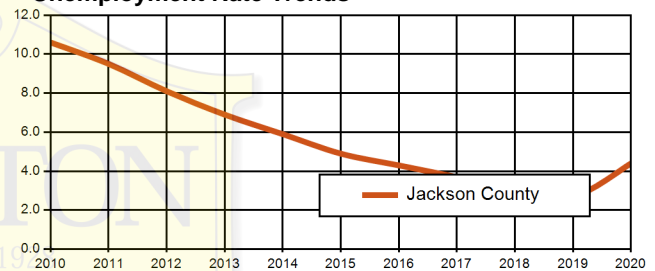

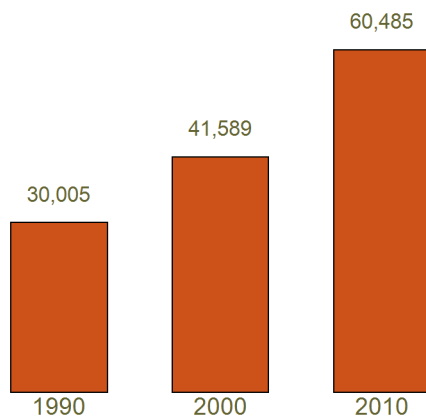
Unemployment Rate Trends

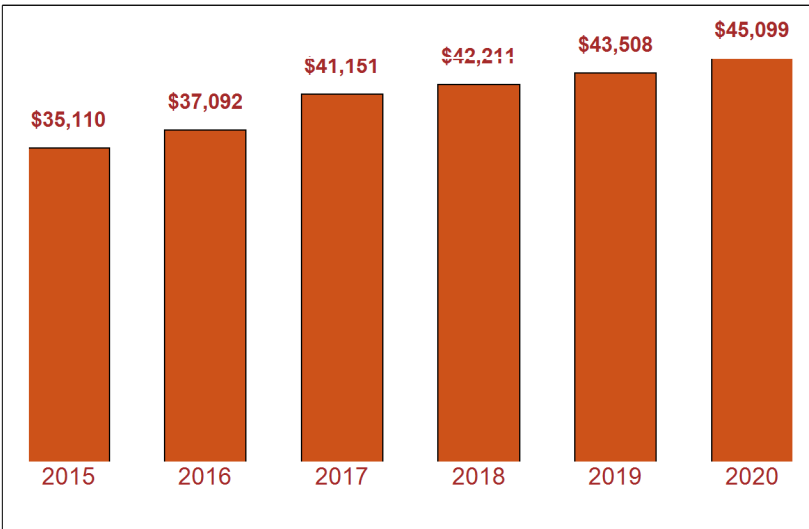

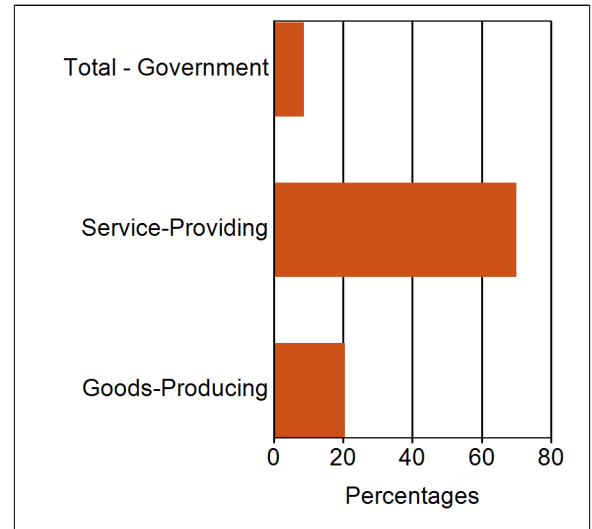
Jackson Per Capita Income
