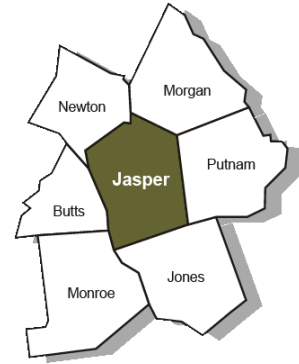

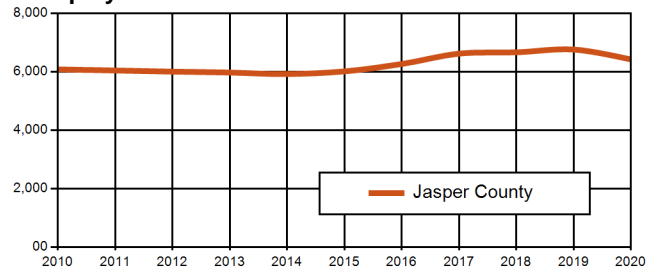

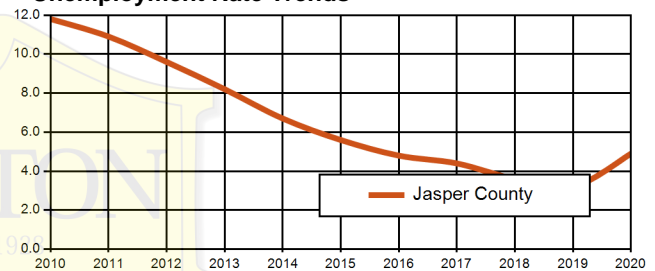

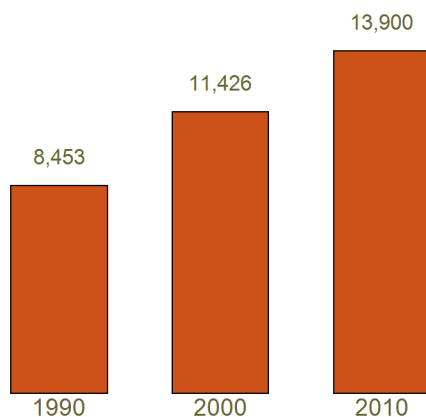
Employment Trends

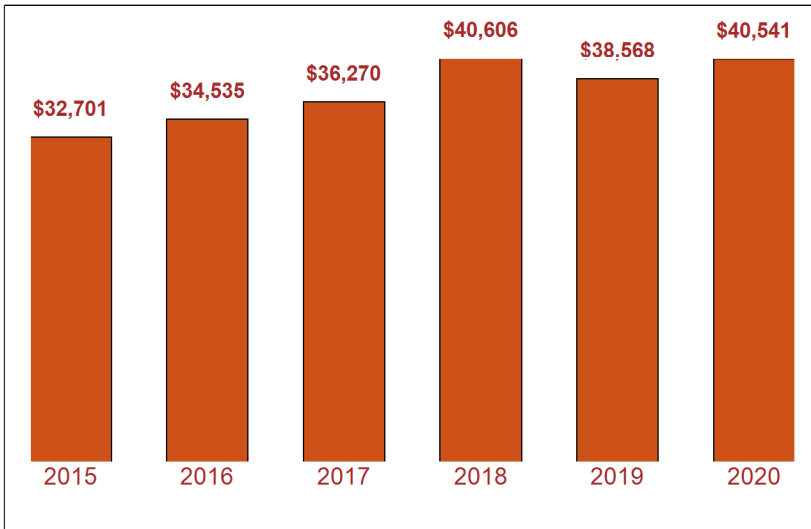

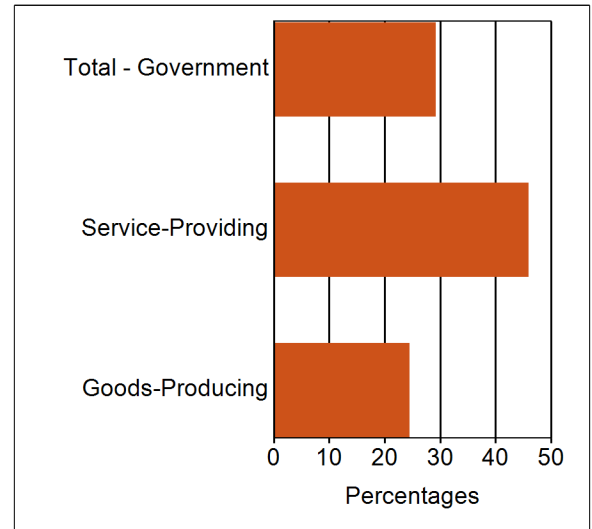
Jasper Per Capita Income
