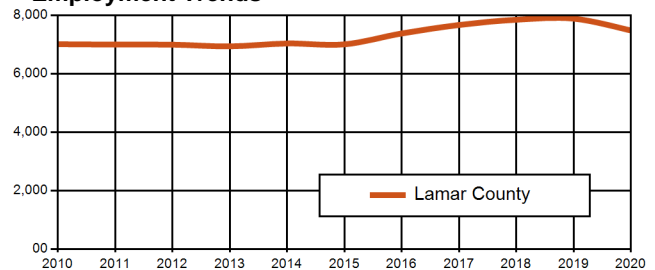

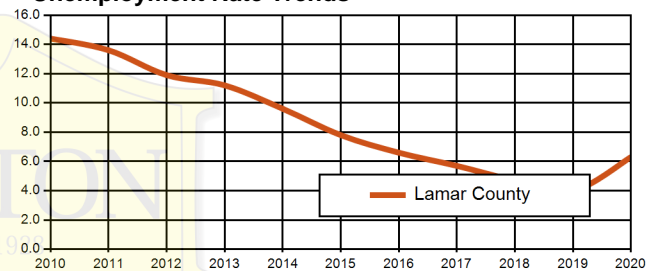

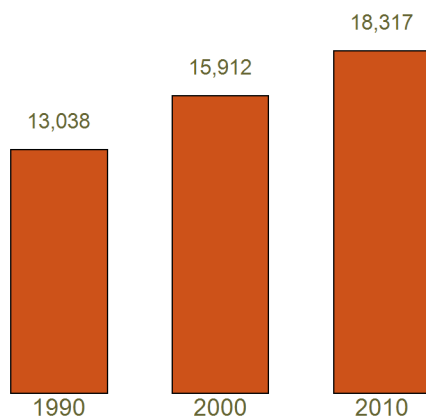

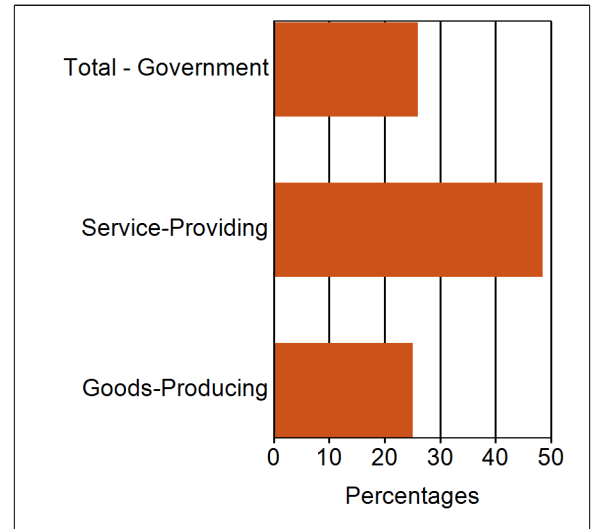
## Lamar Per Capita Income

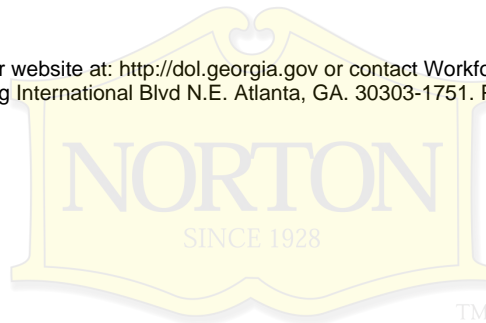
