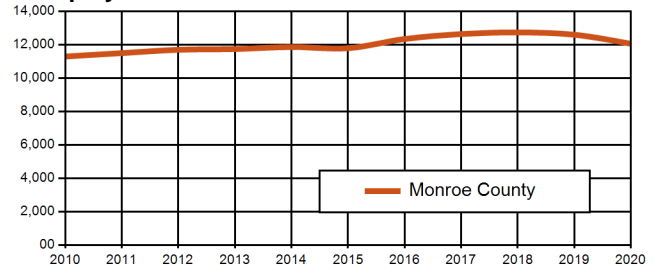

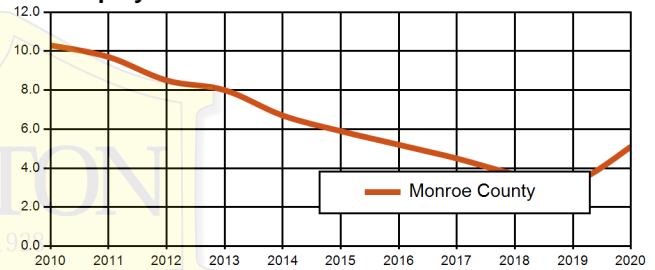

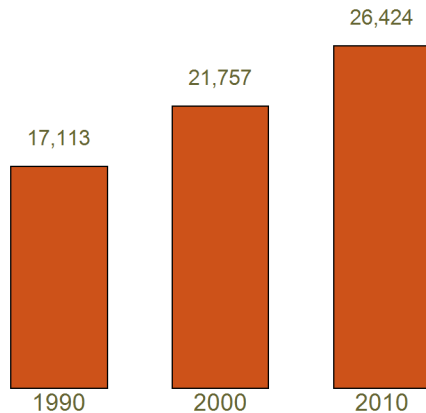
#### Unemployment Rate Trends

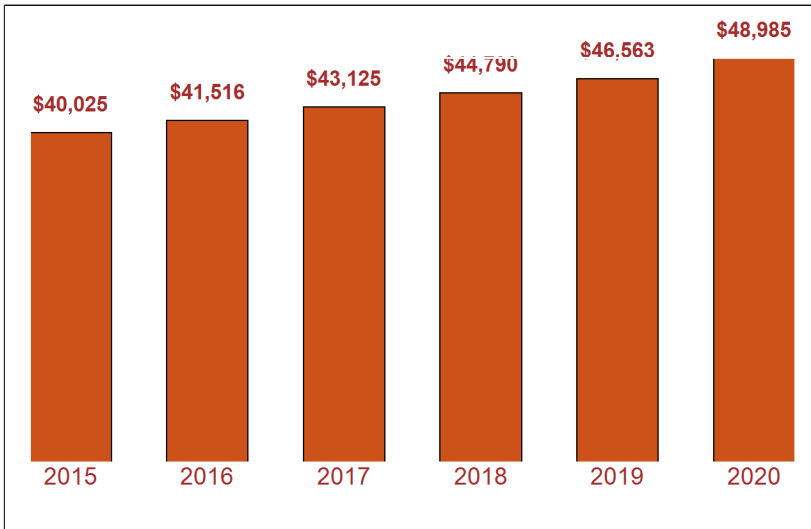

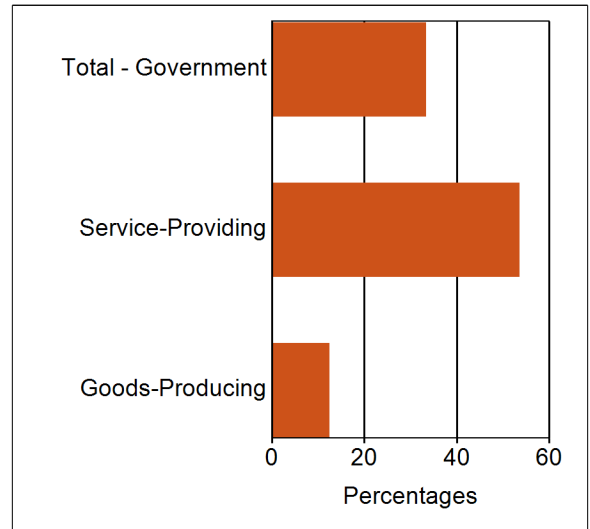
## Monroe Per Capita Income

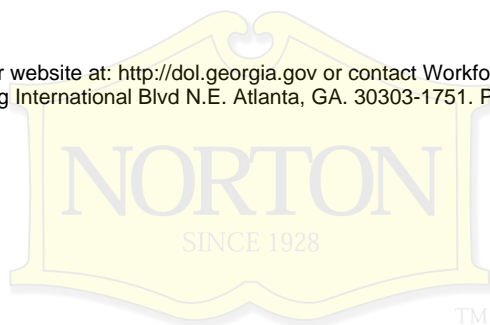
