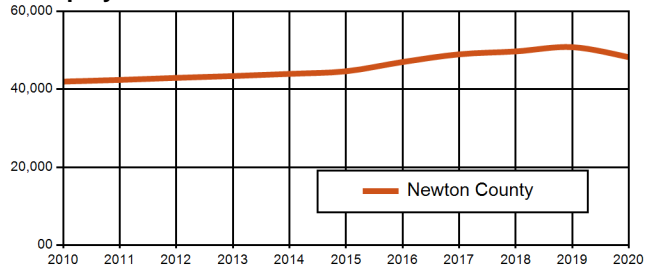

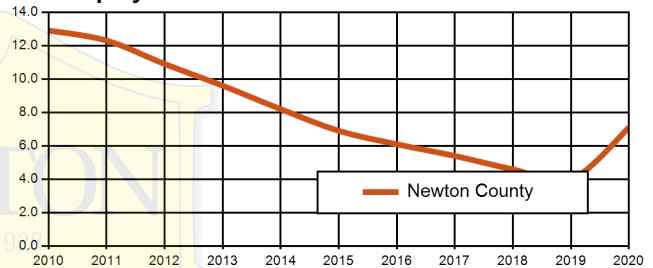

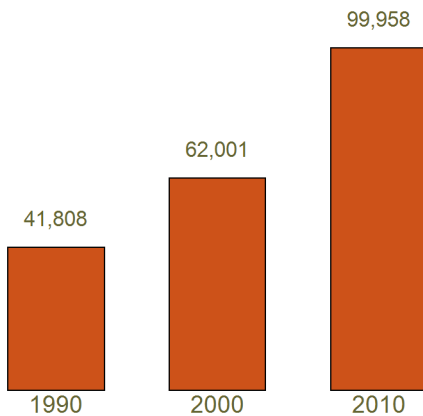
Employment Trends

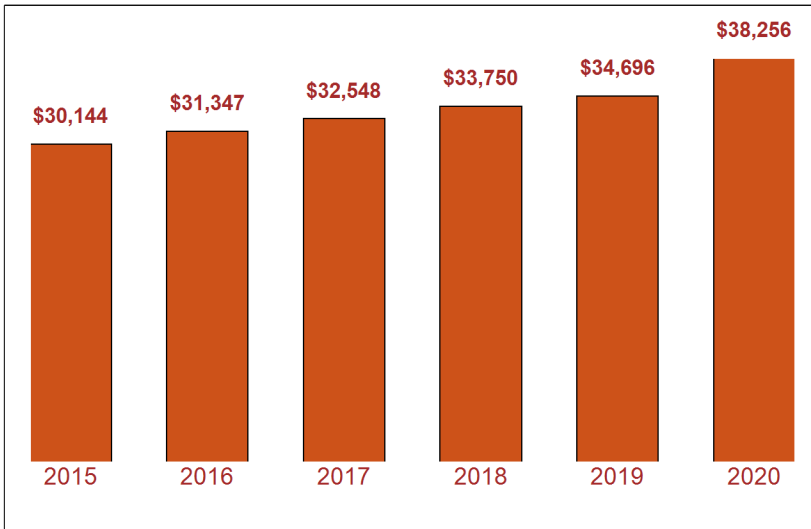

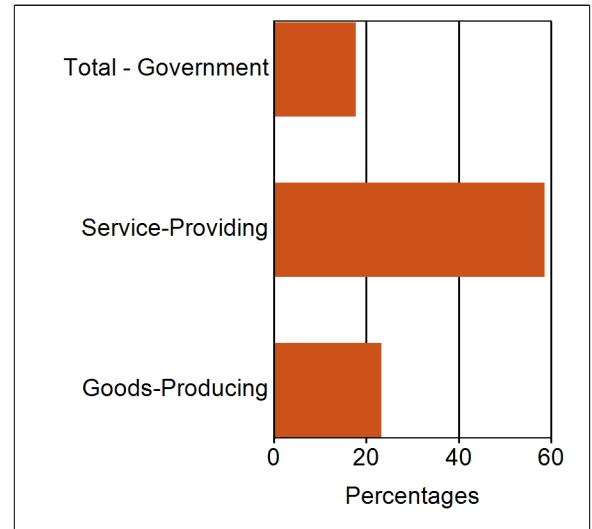
Newton Per Capita Income

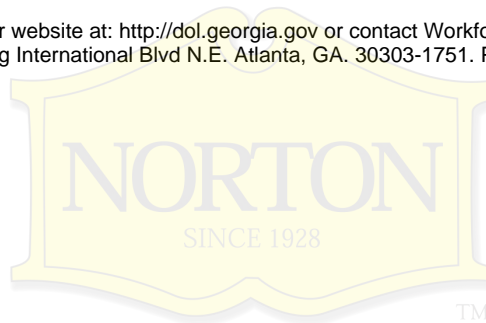
