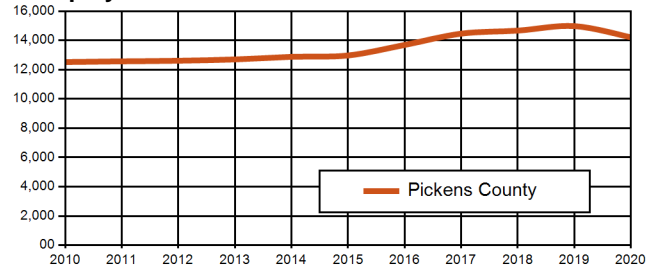

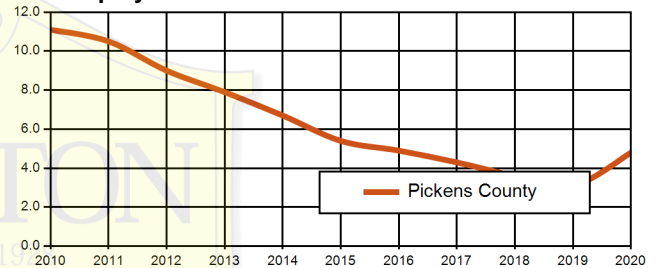

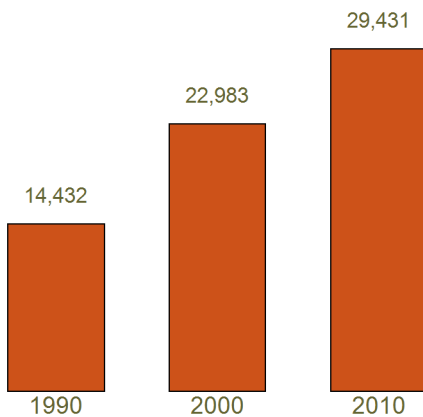

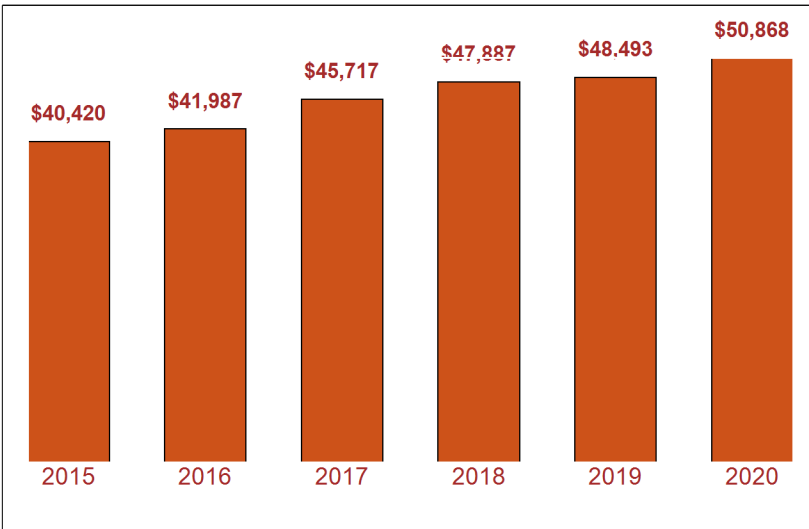

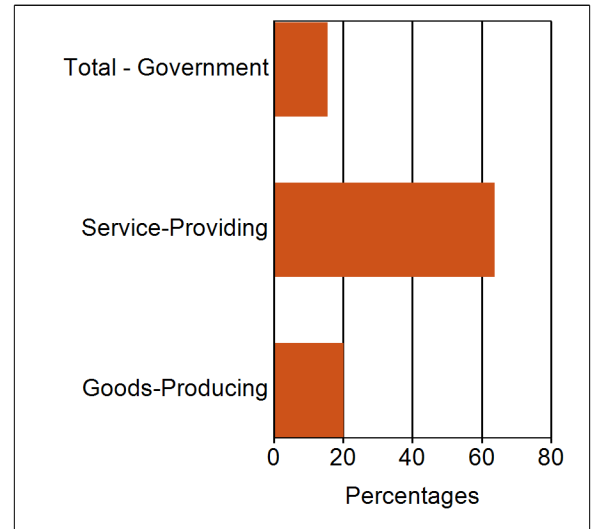
Pickens Per Capita Income
