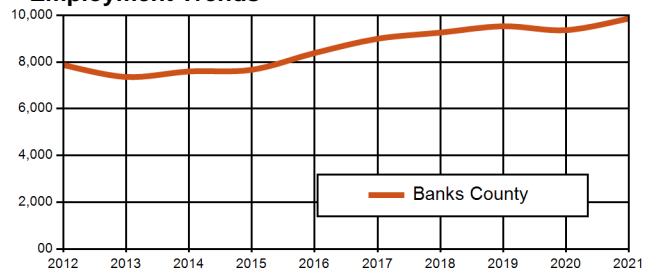

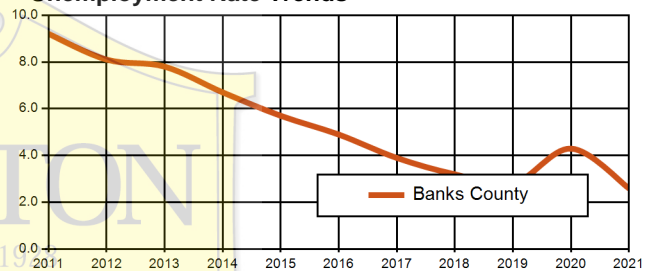

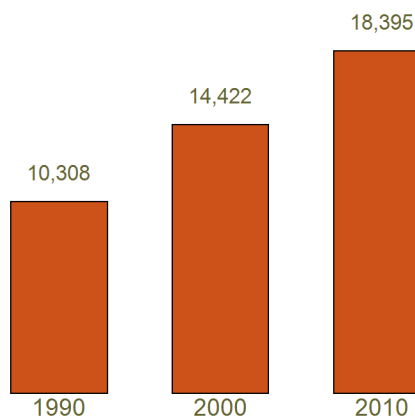
Unemployment Rate Trends

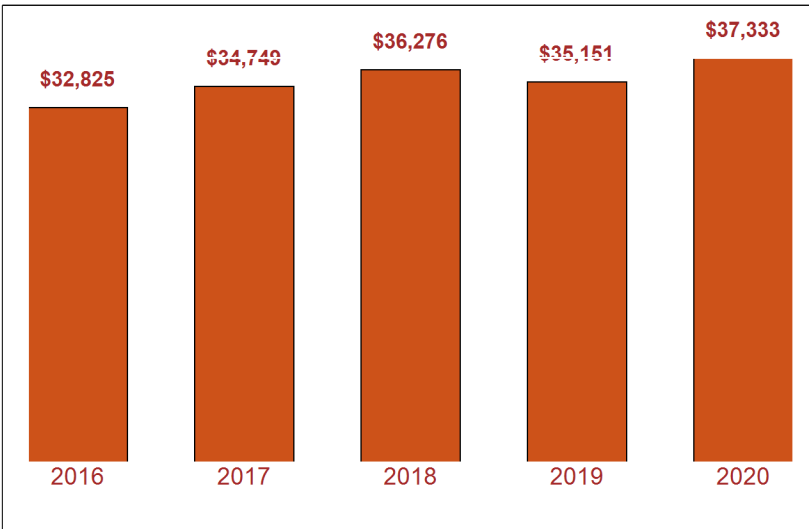

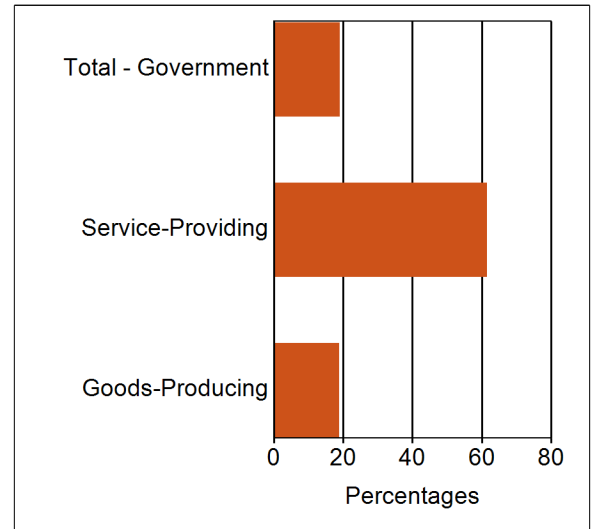
Banks Per Capita Income

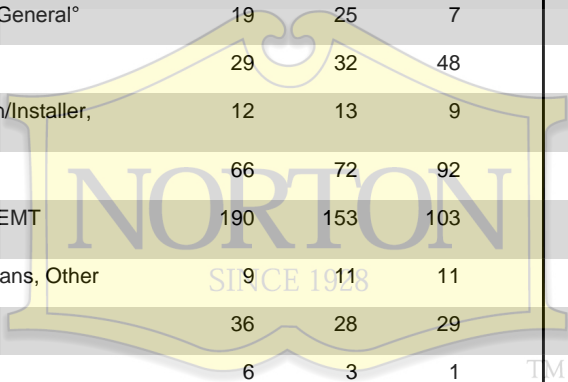

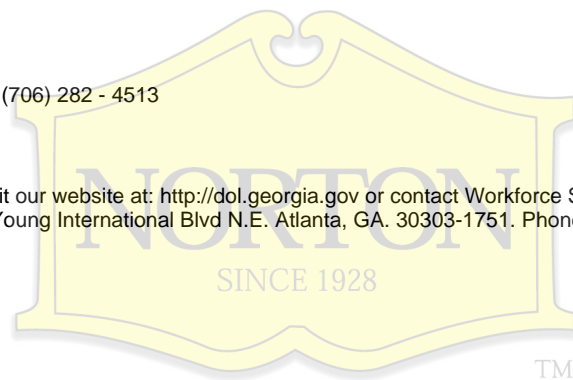
