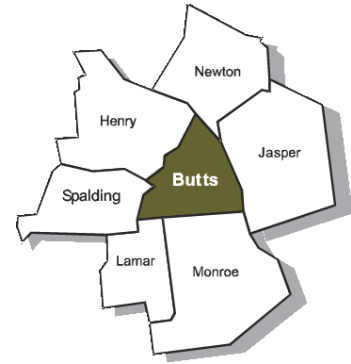

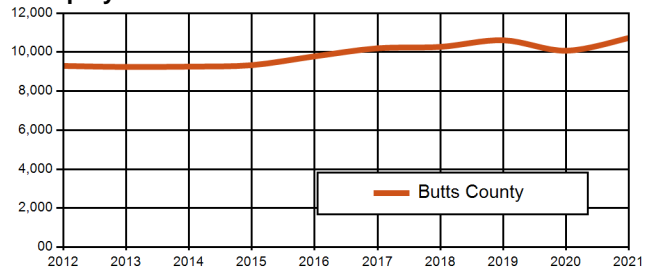

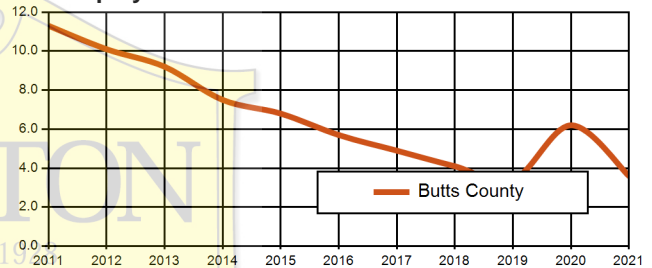

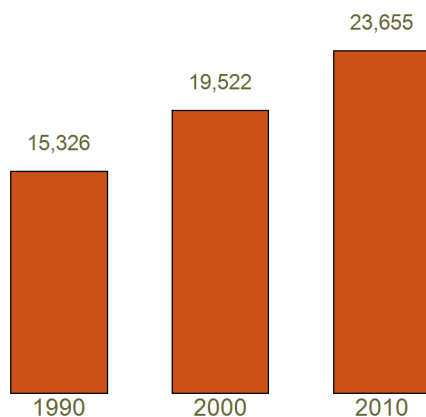
Unemployment Rate Trends

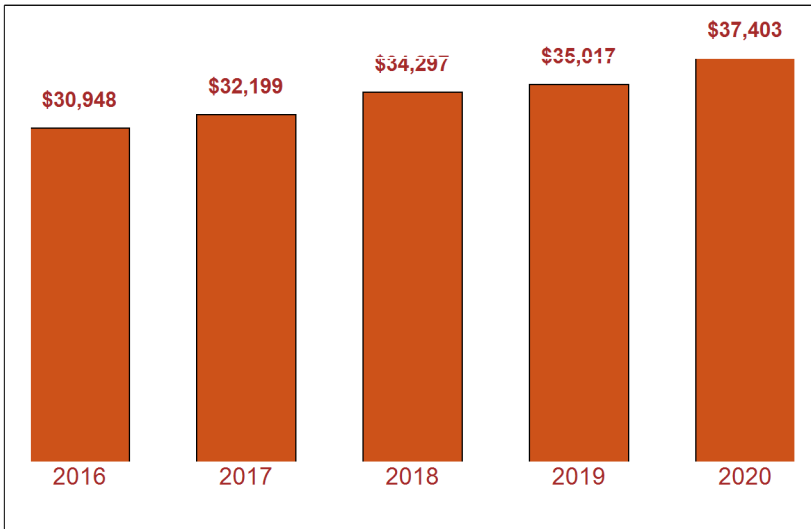

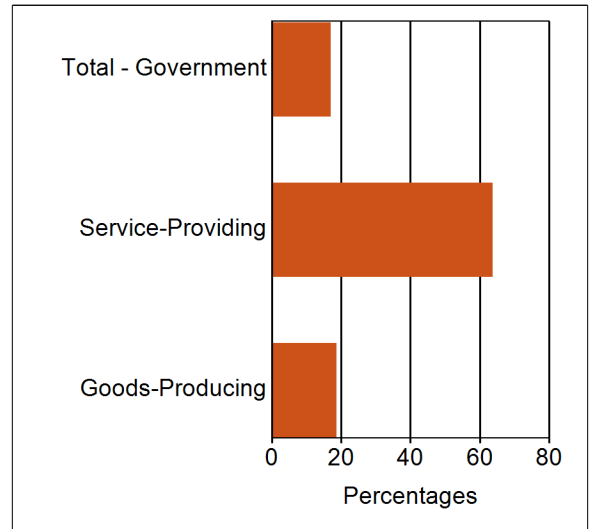
Butts Per Capita Income

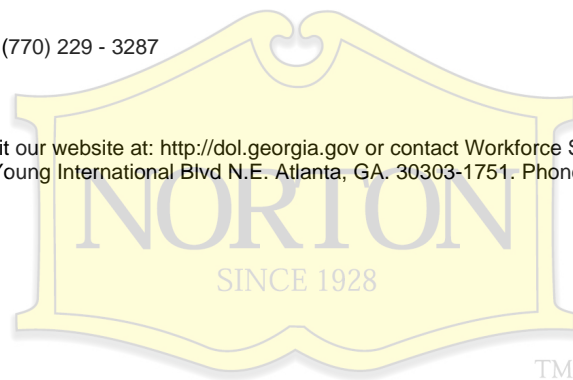
