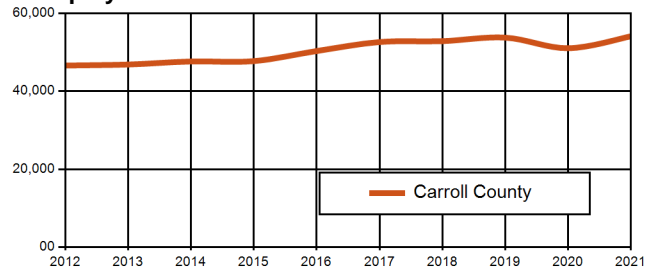

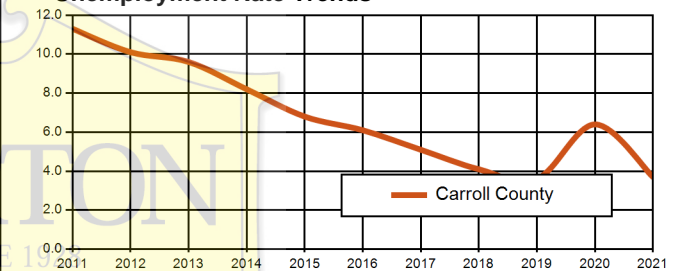

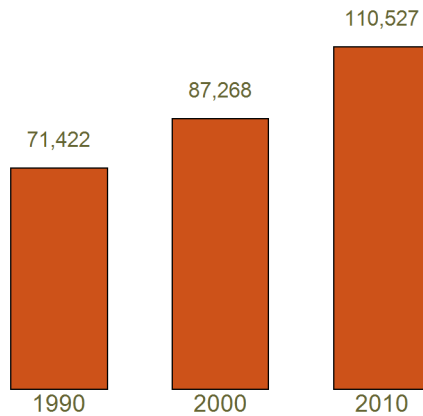
Unemployment Rate Trends

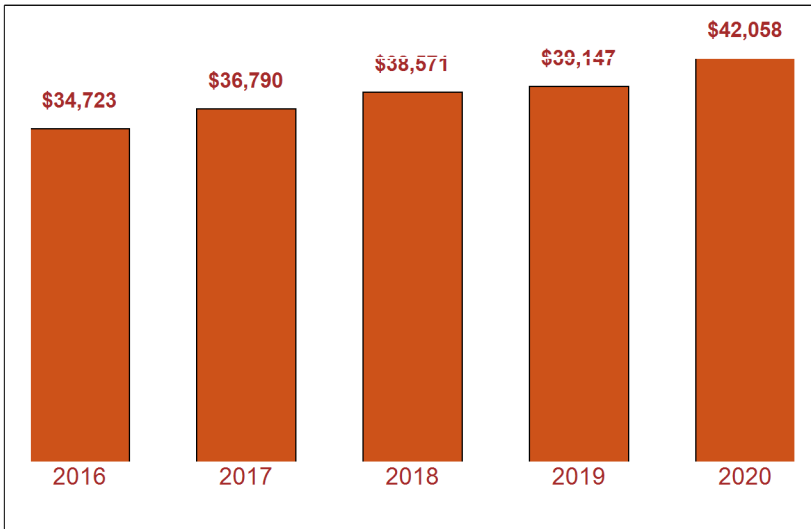

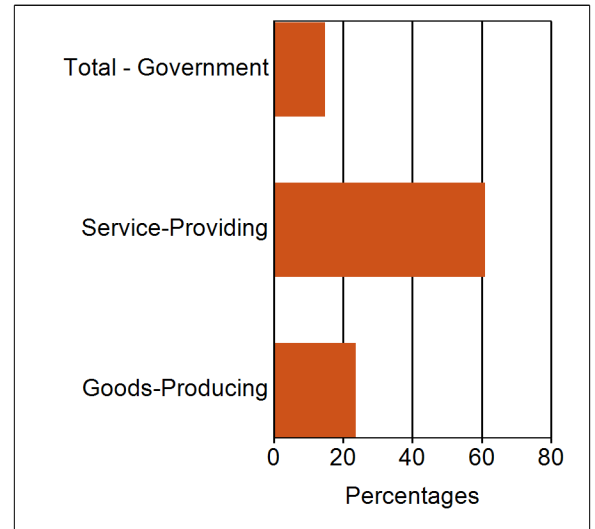
Carroll Per Capita Income

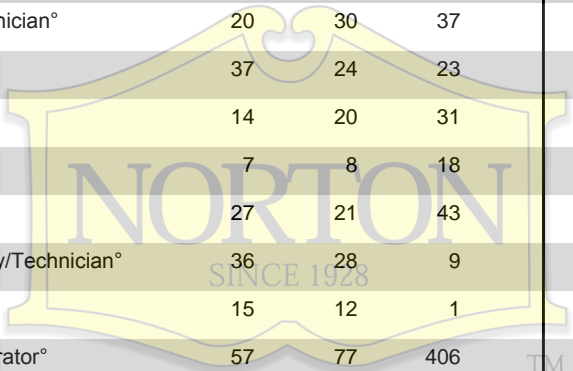
