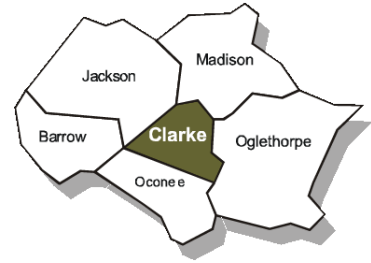

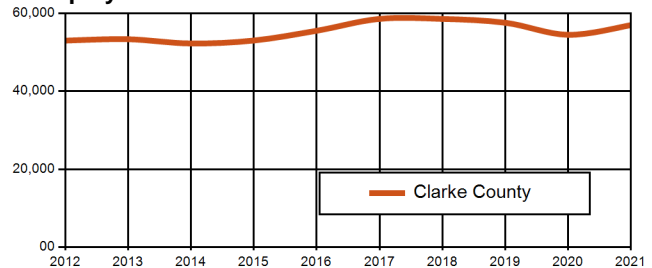

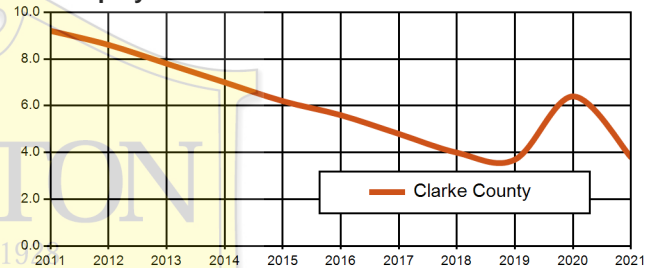

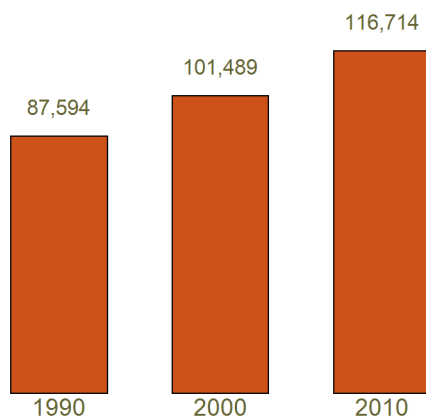
Unemployment Rate Trends

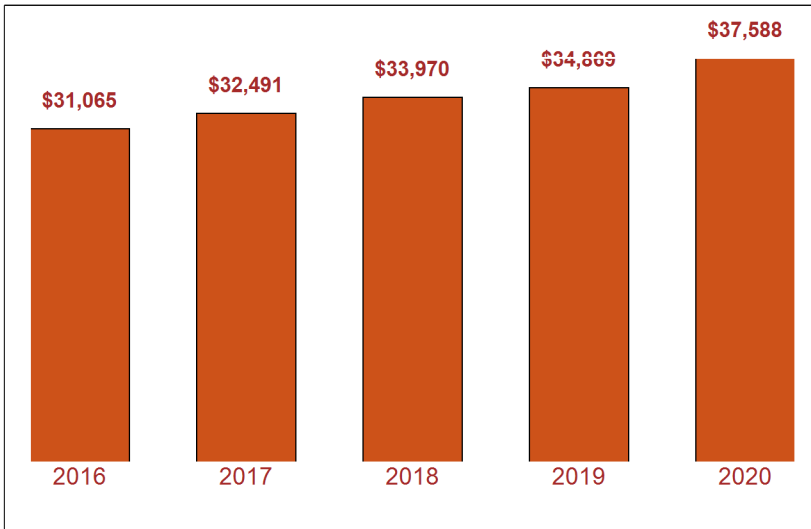

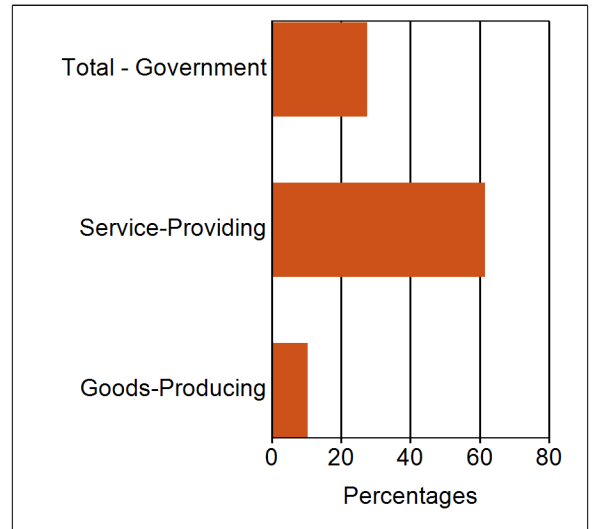
Clarke Per Capita Income
