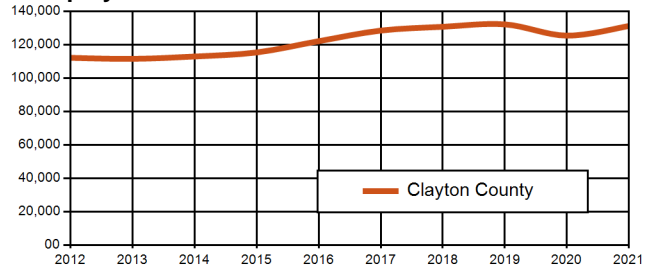

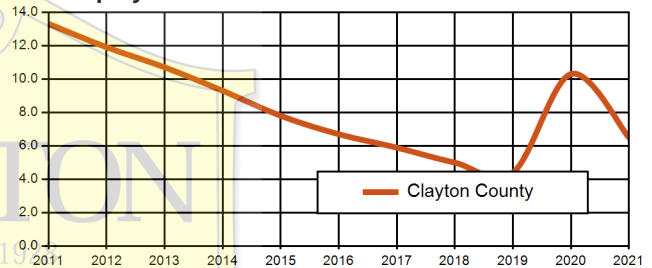

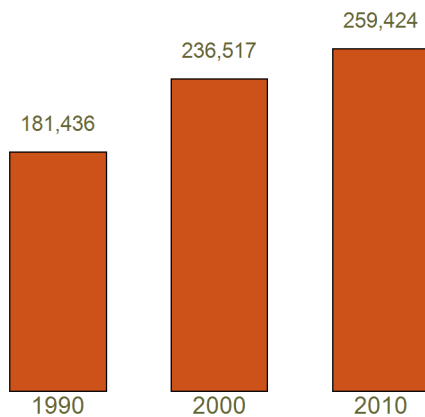
#### Unemployment Rate Trends

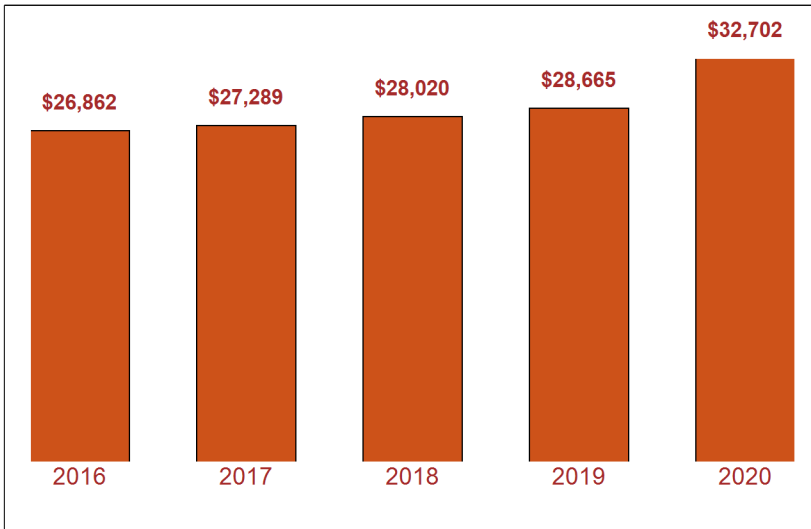

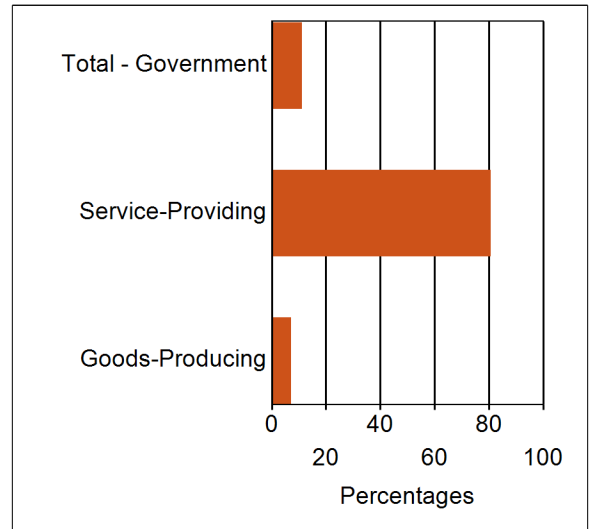
## Clayton Per Capita Income
