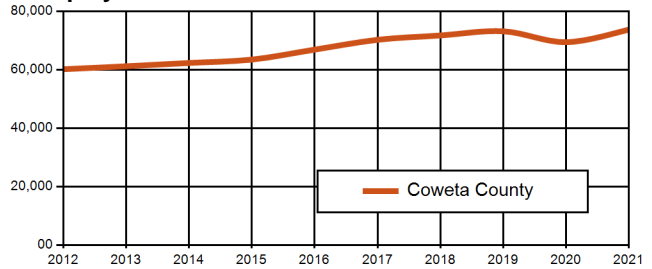

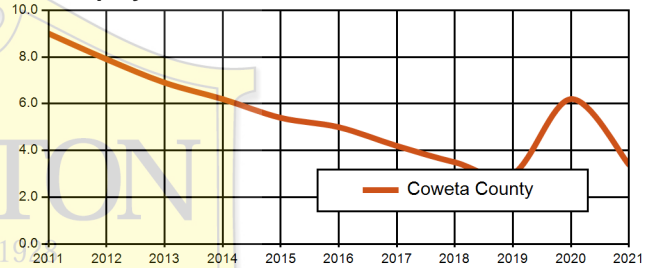

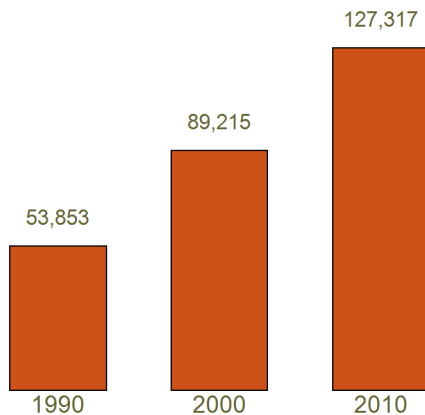
#### Unemployment Rate Trends

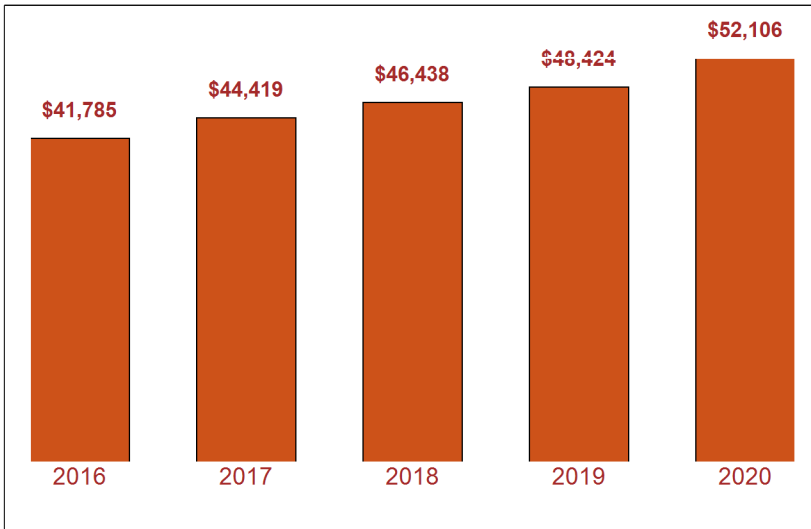

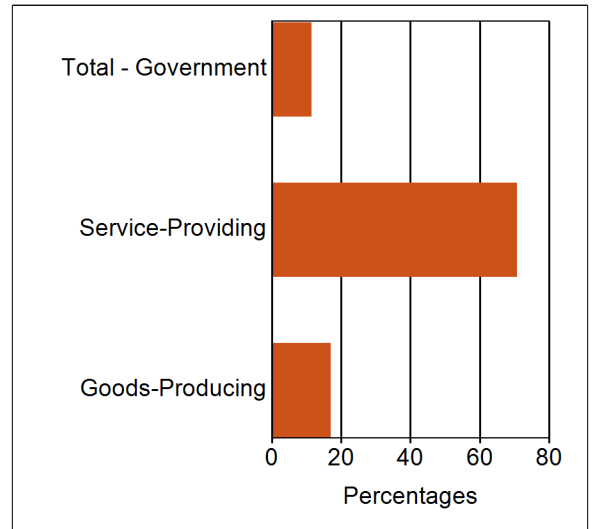
## Coweta Per Capita Income

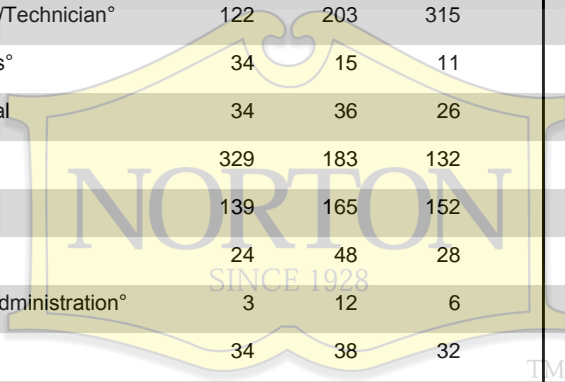
