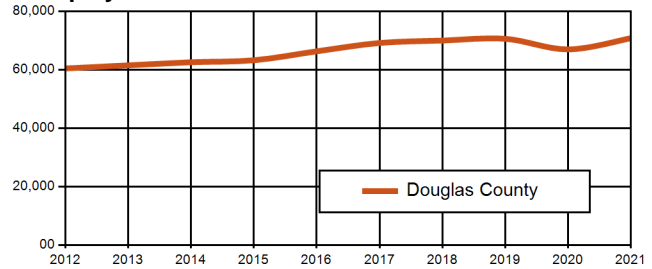

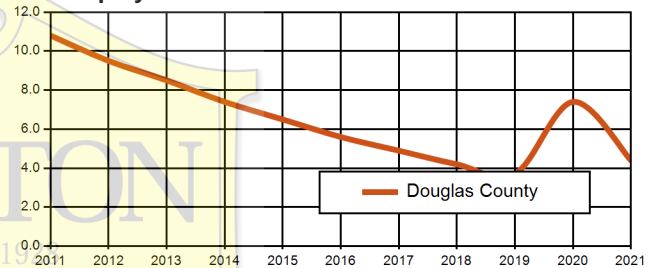

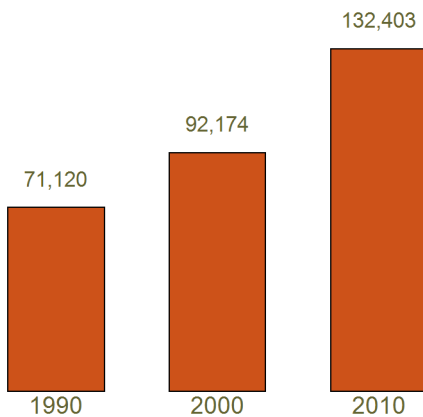

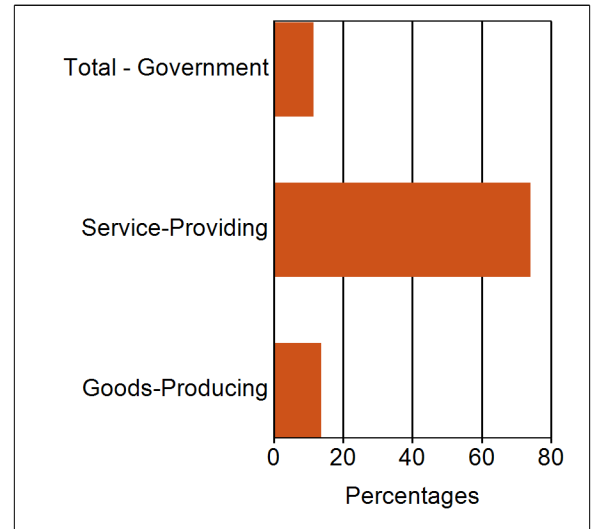
## Douglas Per Capita Income

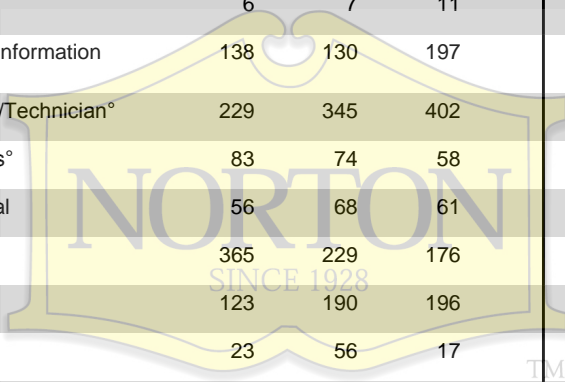
