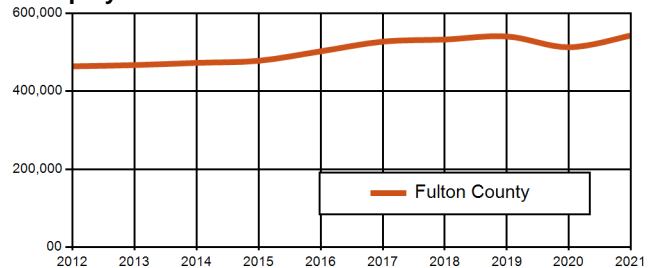

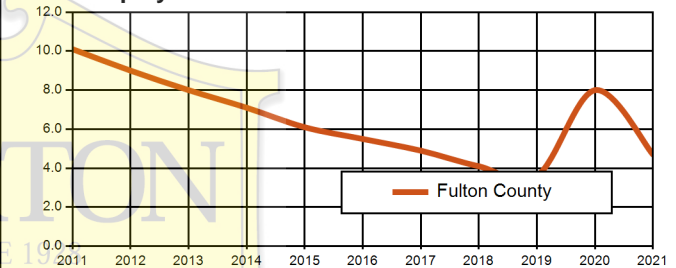

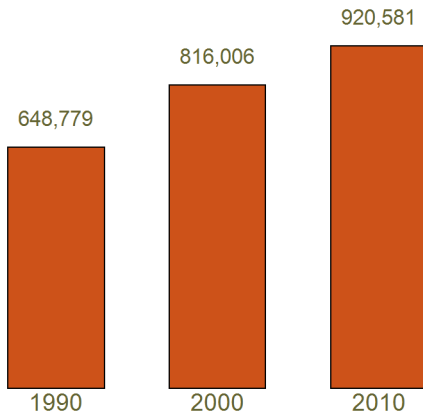
Unemployment Rate Trends

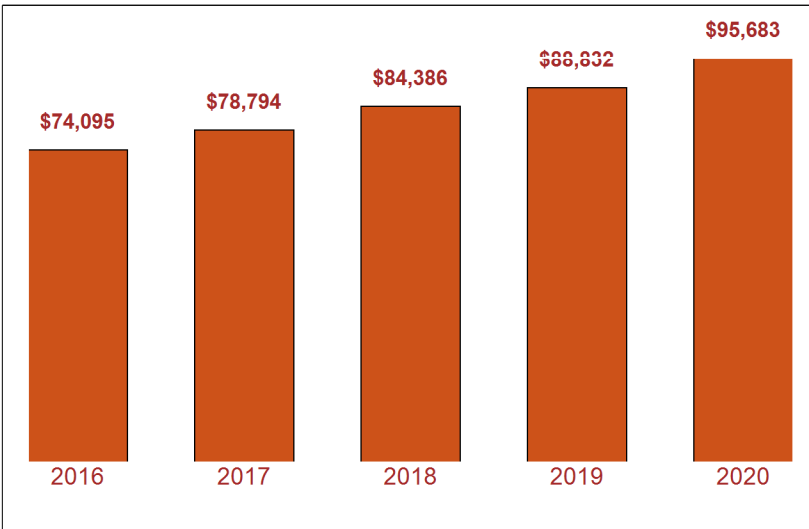

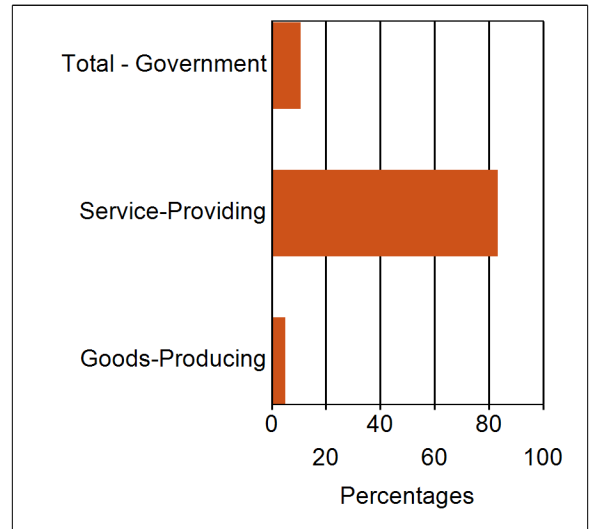
Fulton Per Capita Income
