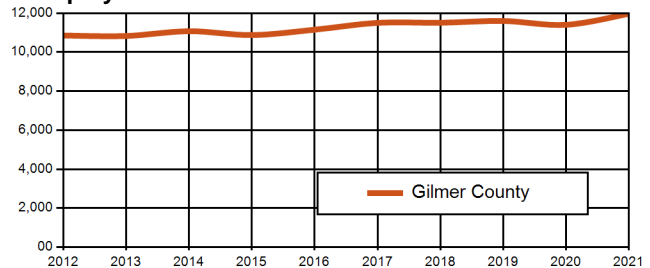

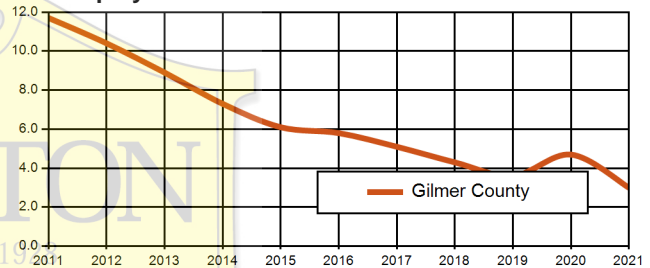

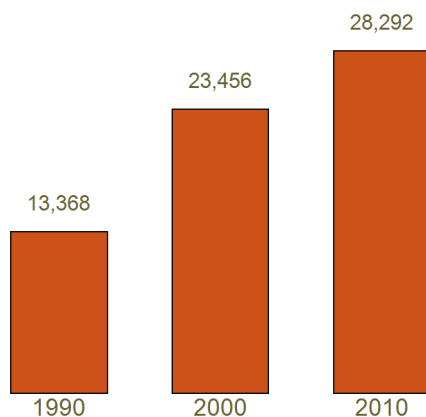
Unemployment Rate Trends

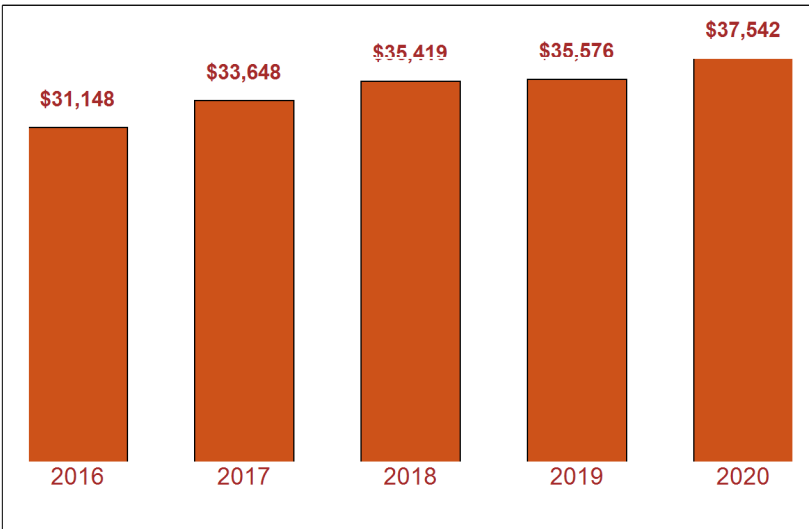

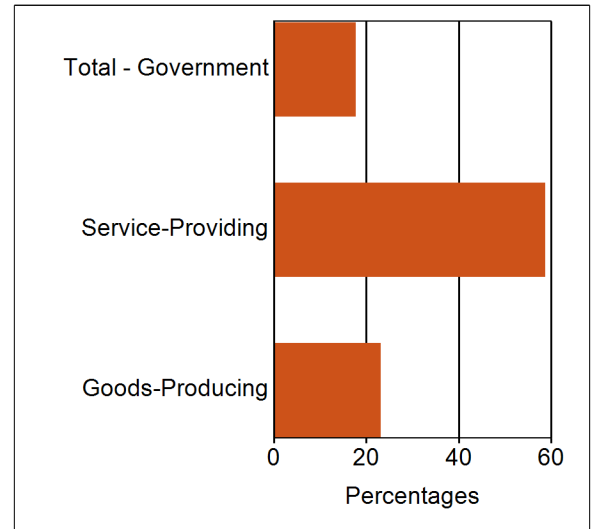
Gilmer Per Capita Income
