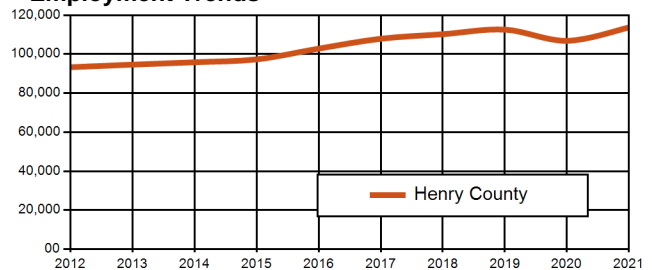

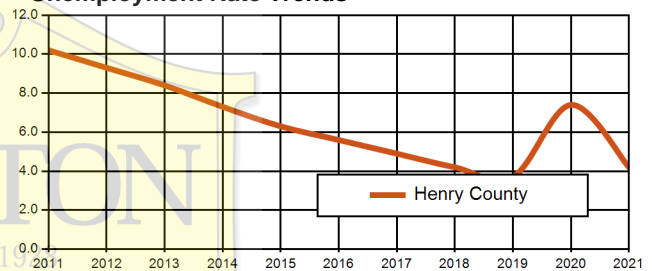

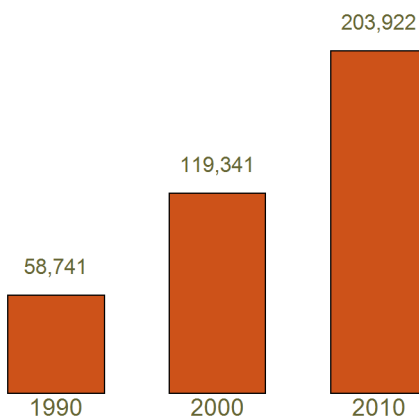
Unemployment Rate Trends

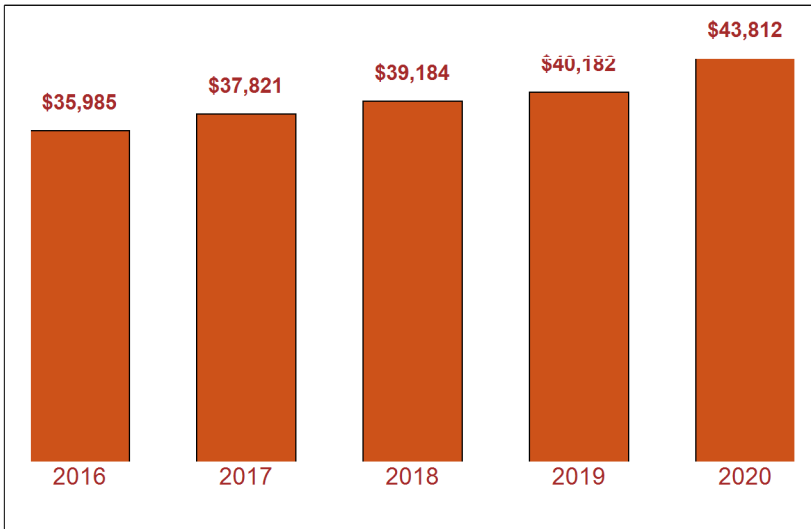

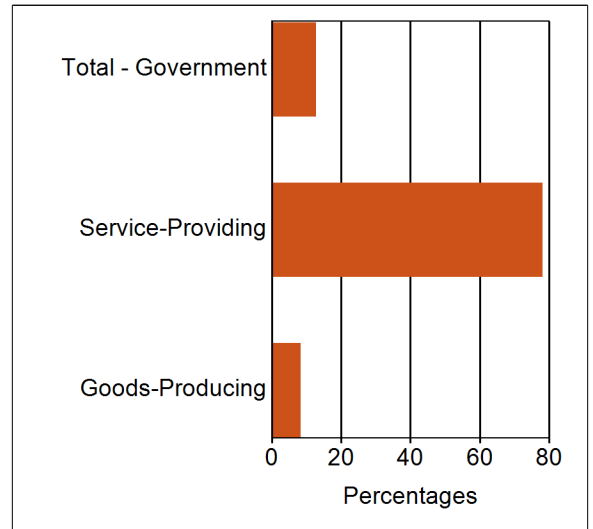
Henry Per Capita Income

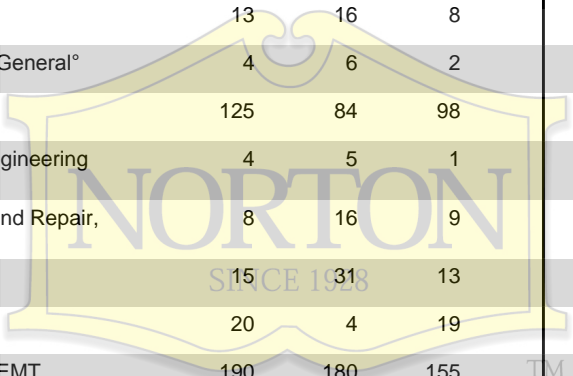

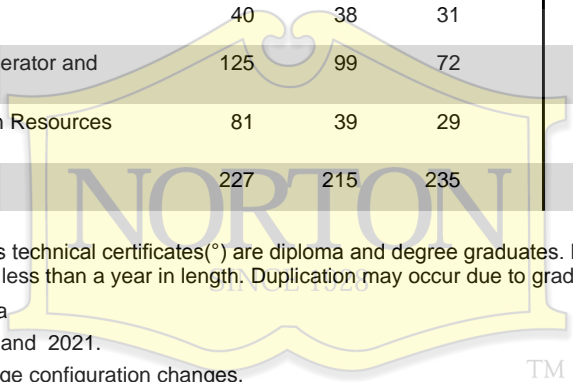
