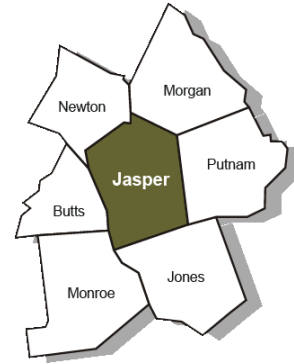

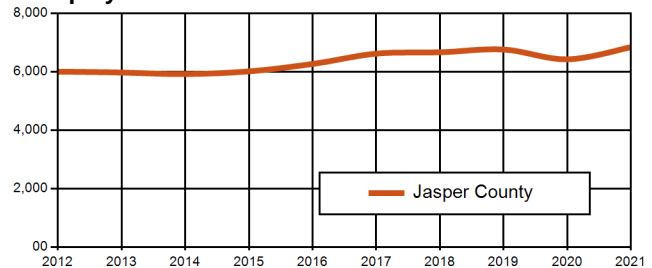

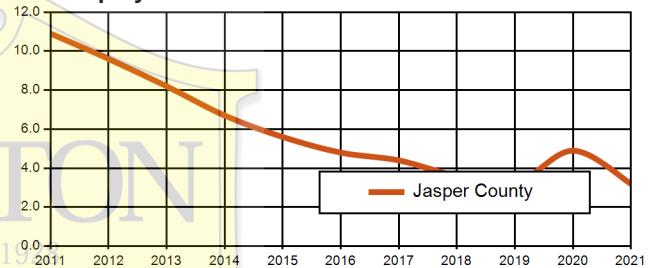

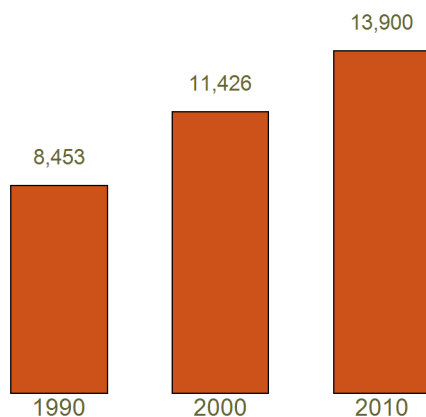
Unemployment Rate Trends

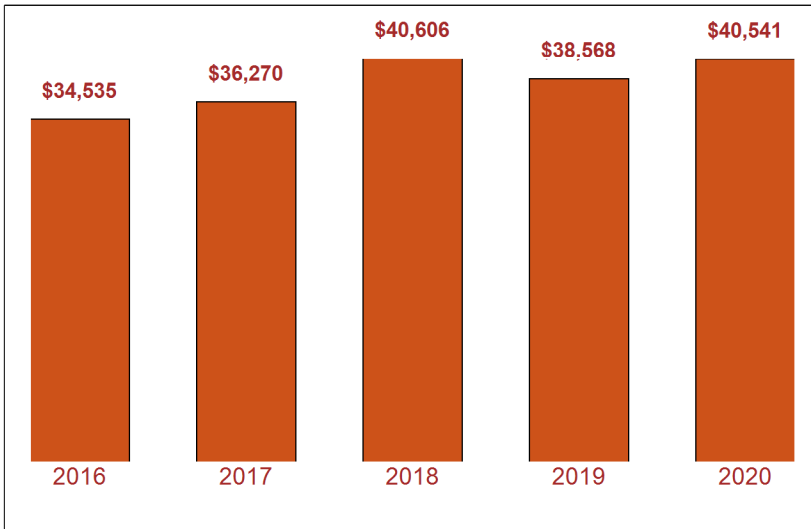

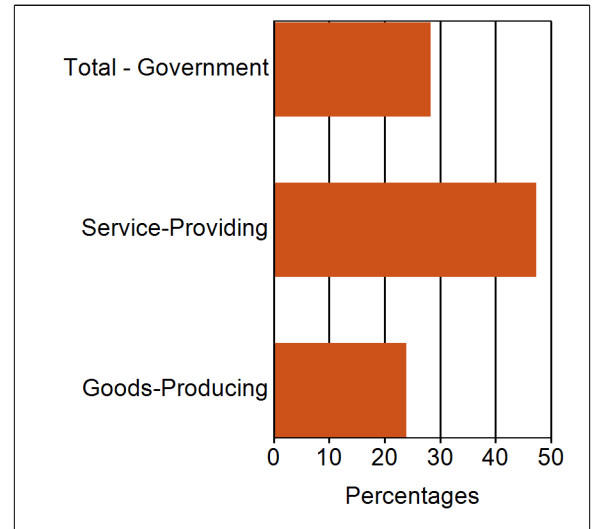
## Jasper Per Capita Income

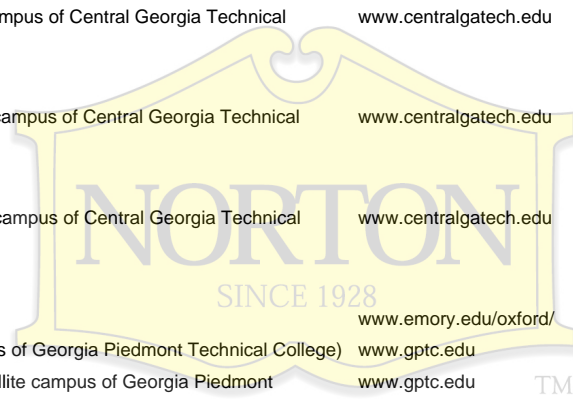

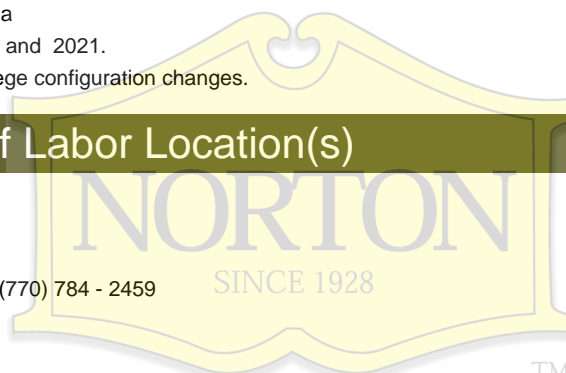
