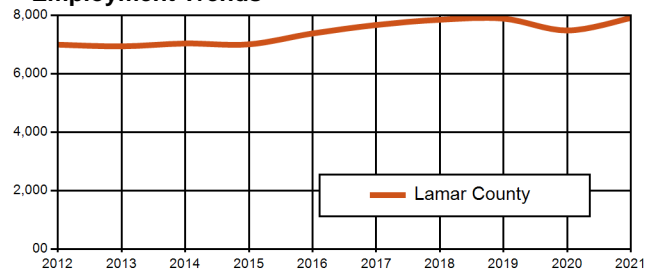

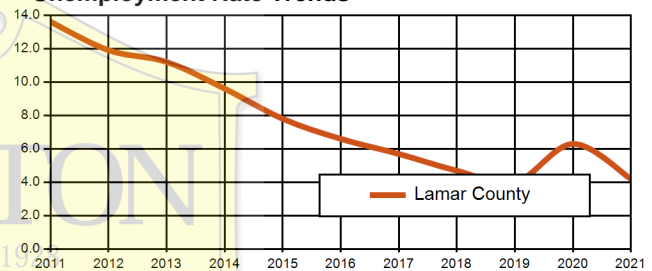

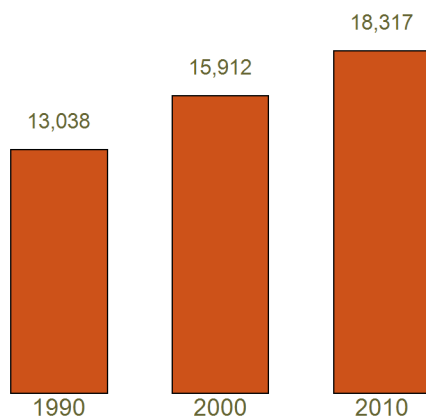
Unemployment Rate Trends

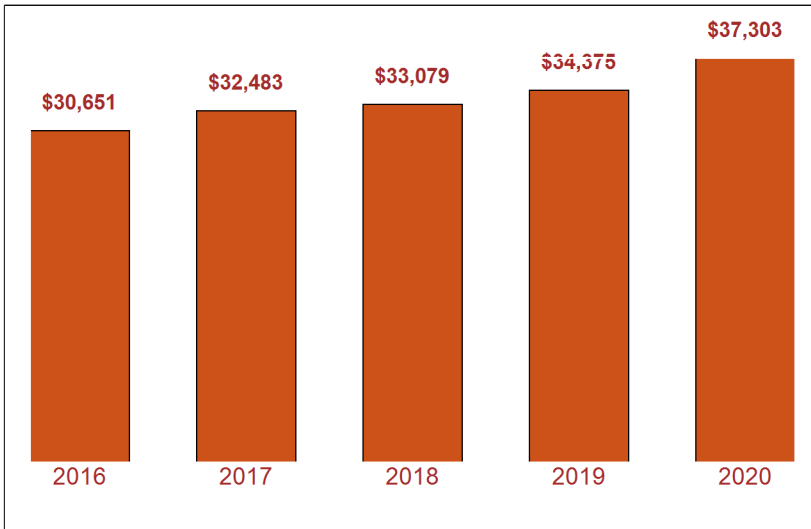

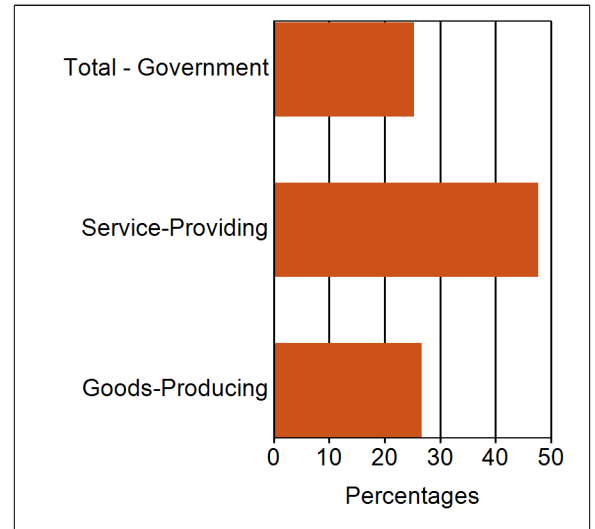
Lamar Per Capita Income
