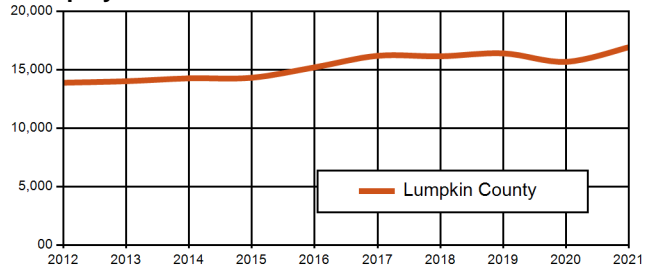

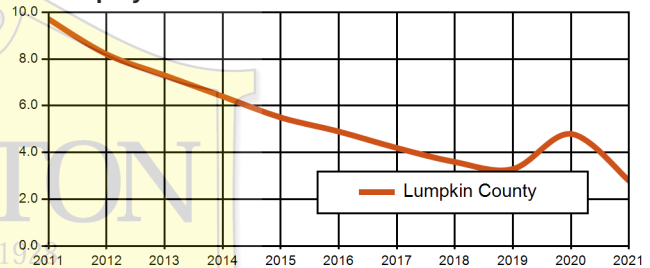

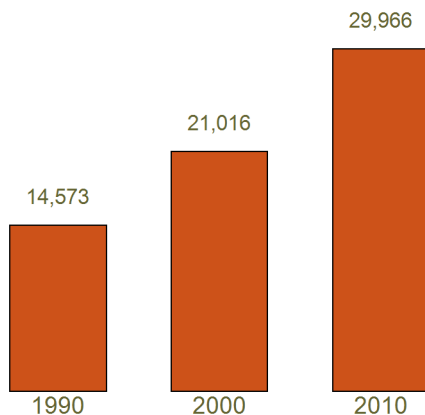
Unemployment Rate Trends

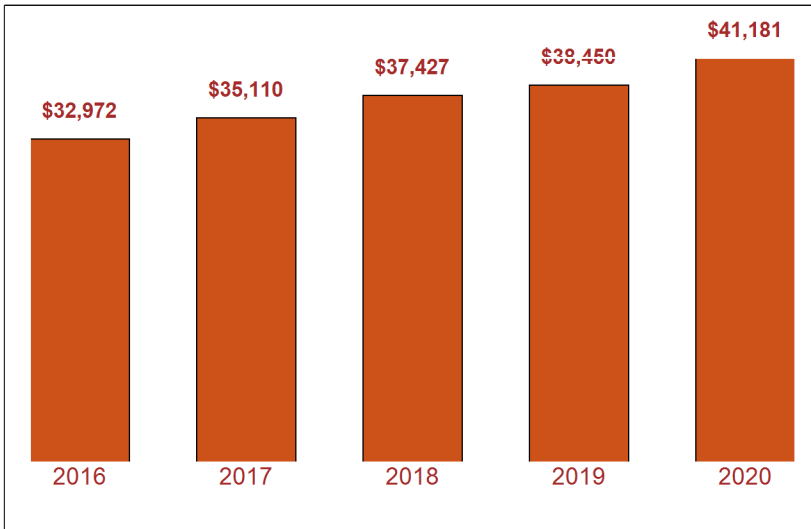

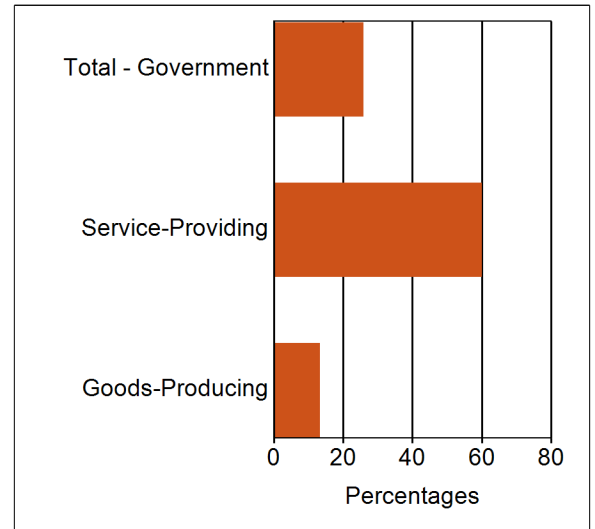
Lumpkin Per Capita Income

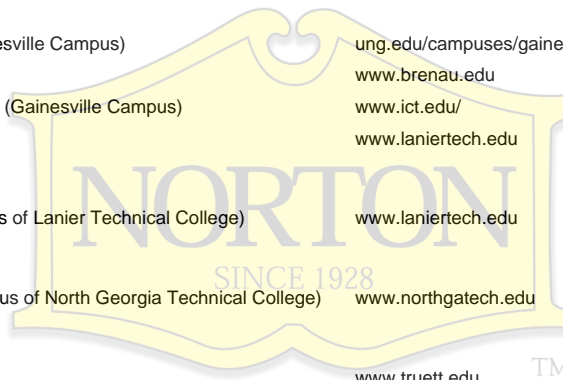
