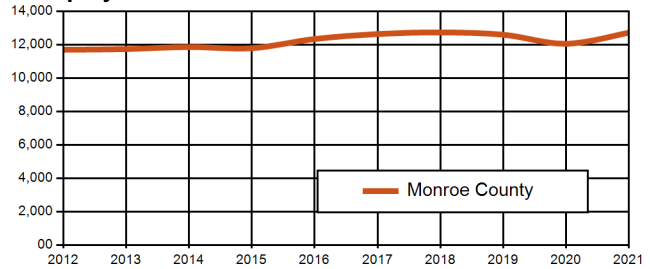

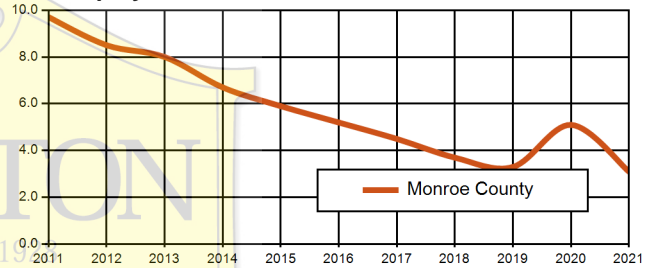

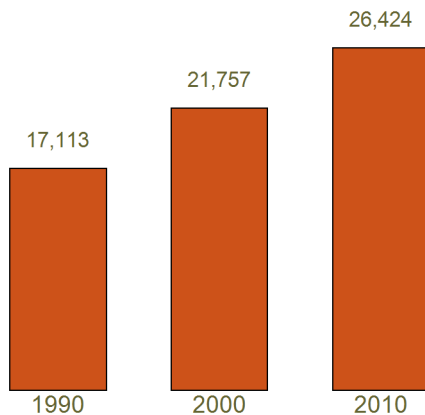
Unemployment Rate Trends

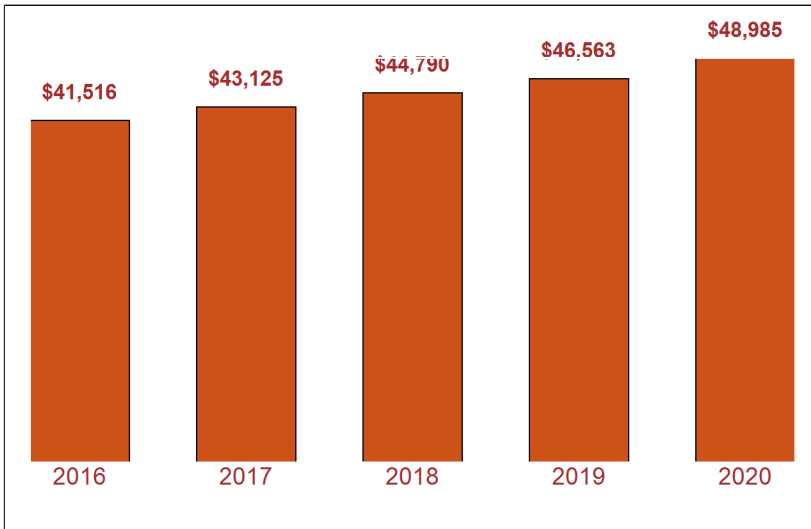

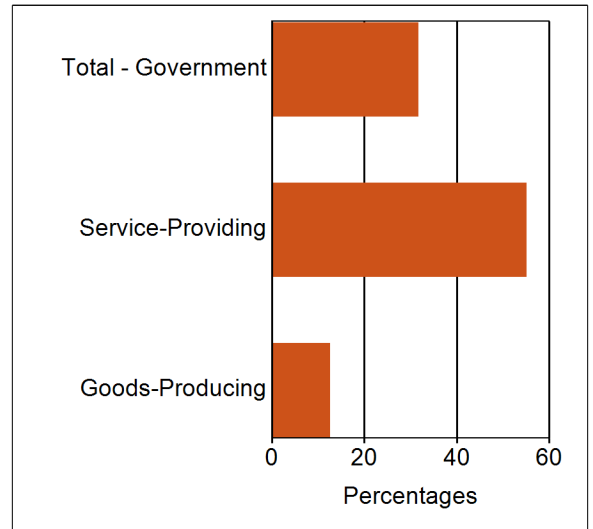
Monroe Per Capita Income
