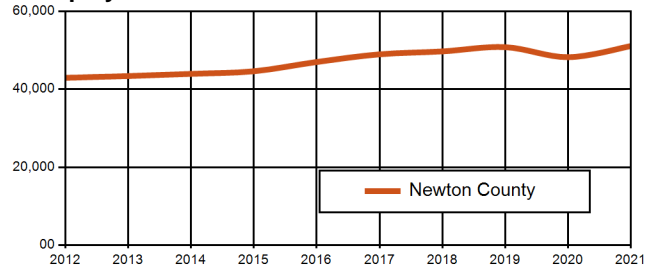

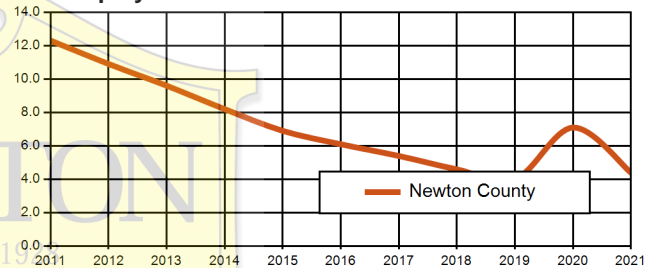

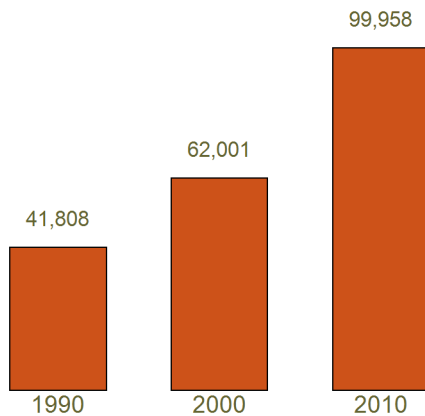
Unemployment Rate Trends

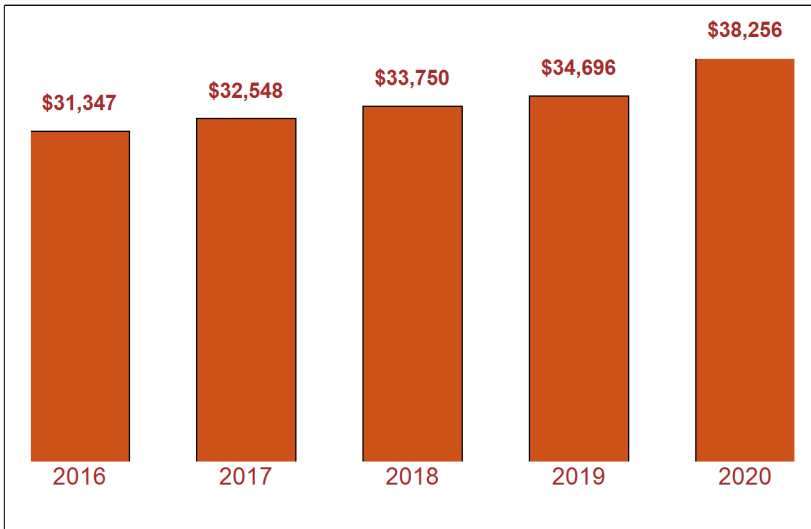

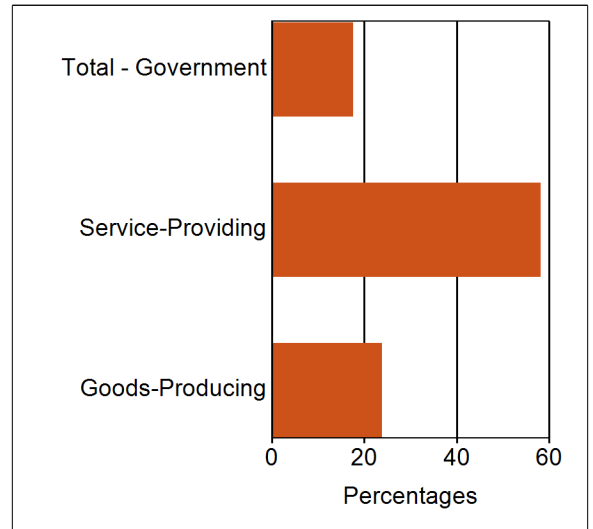
Newton Per Capita Income
