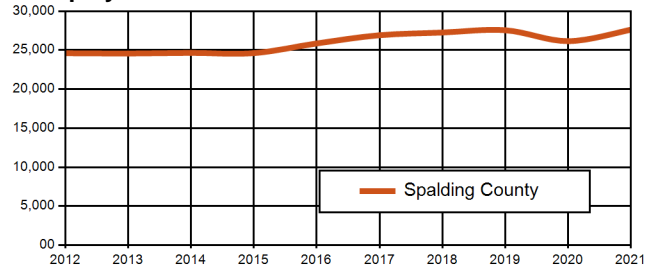

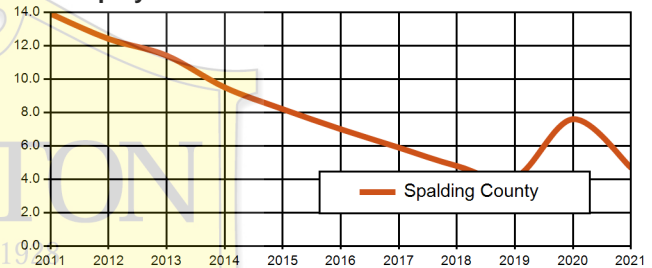

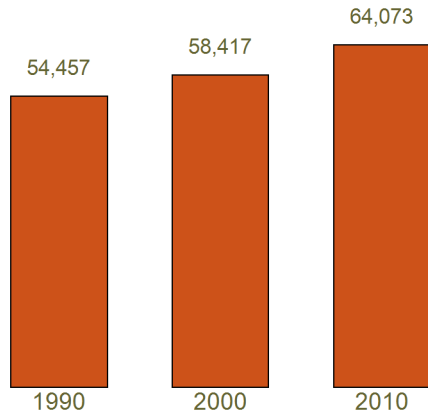
Unemployment Rate Trends

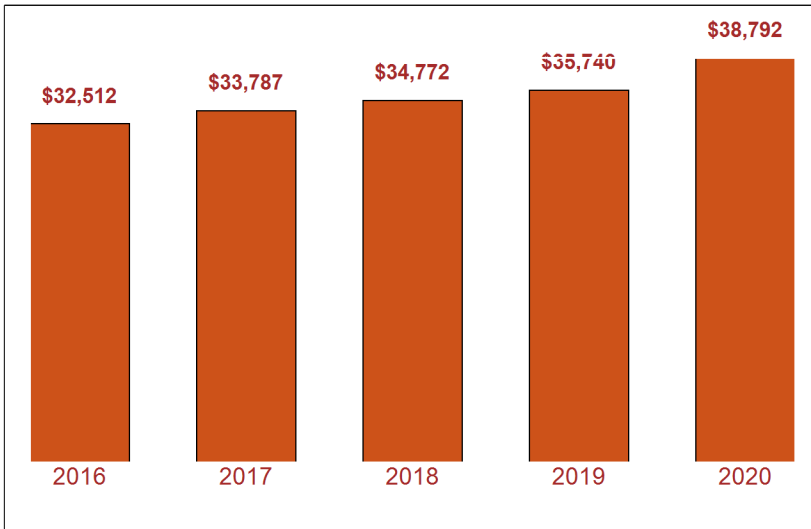

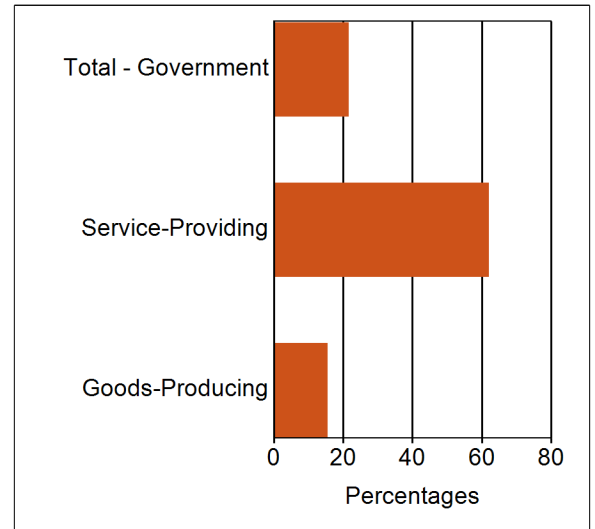
Spalding Per Capita Income
