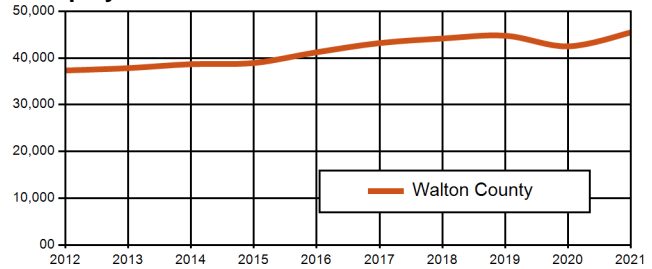

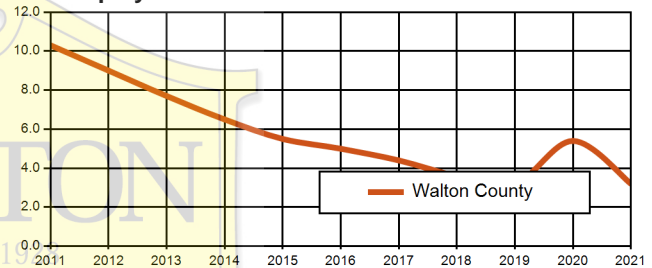

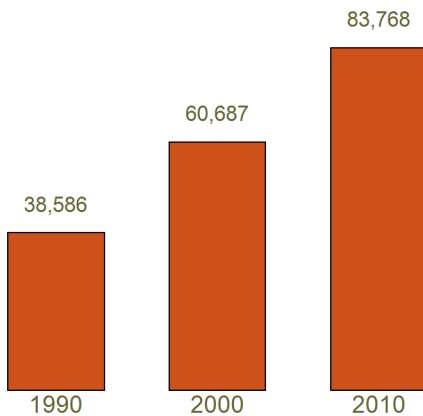
Unemployment Rate Trends

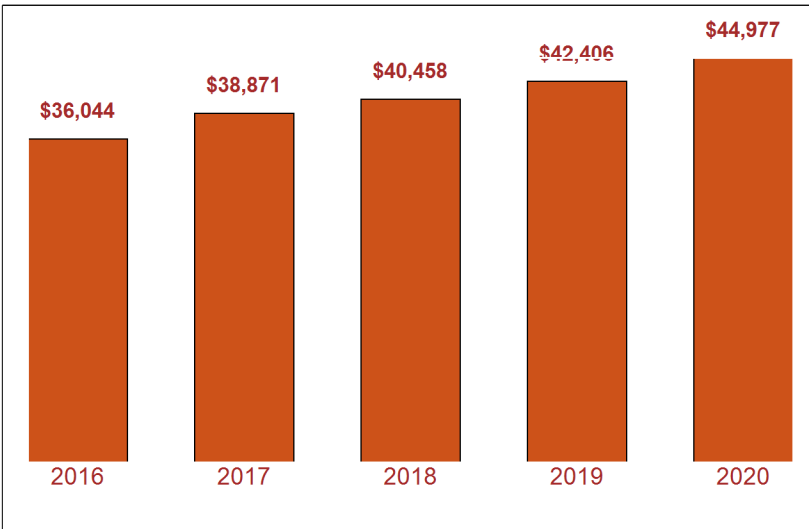

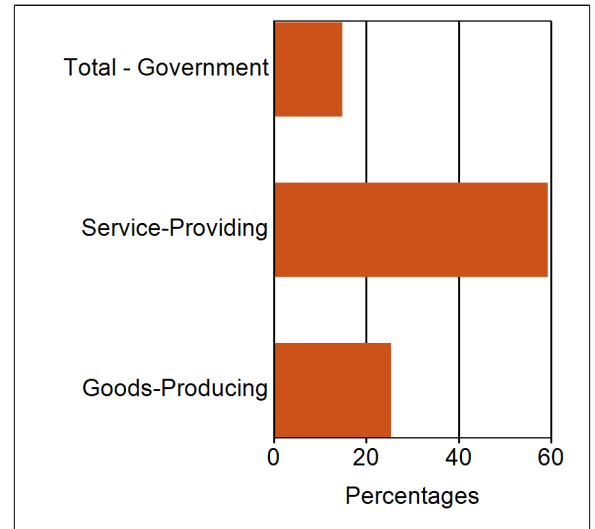
Walton Per Capita Income

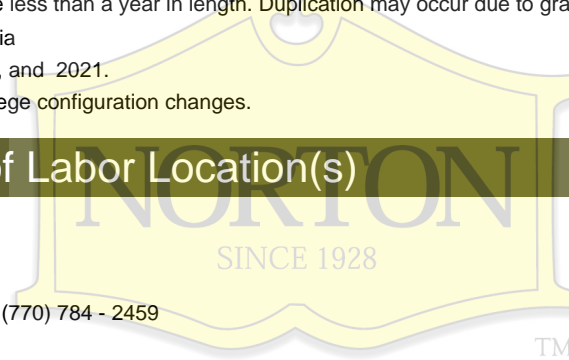
