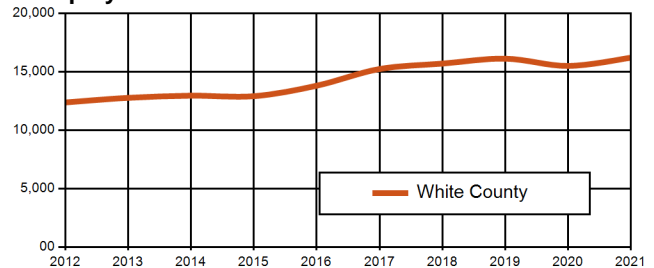

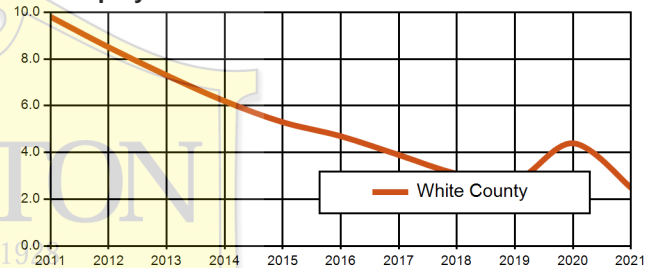

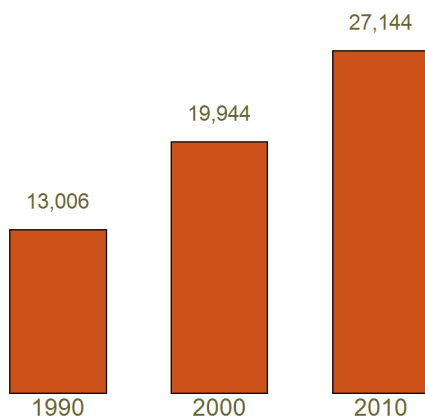

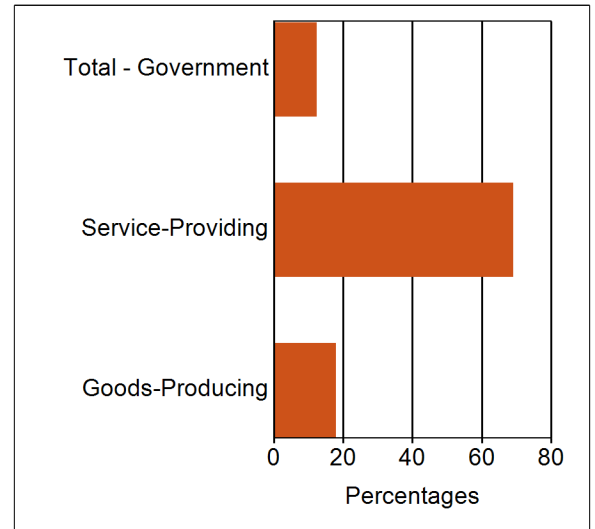
White Per Capita Income

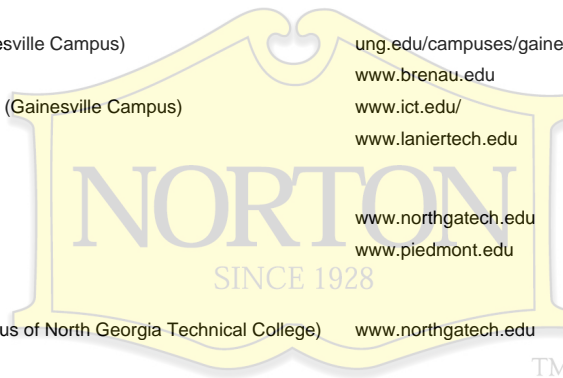

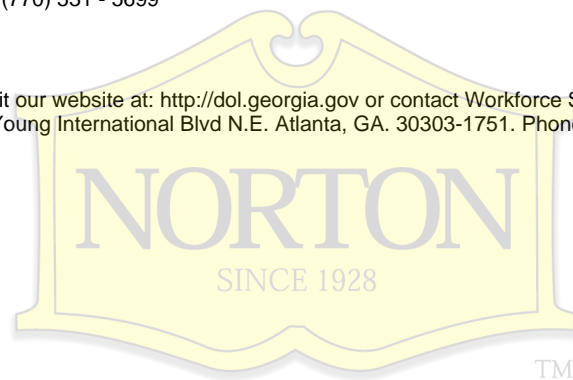
