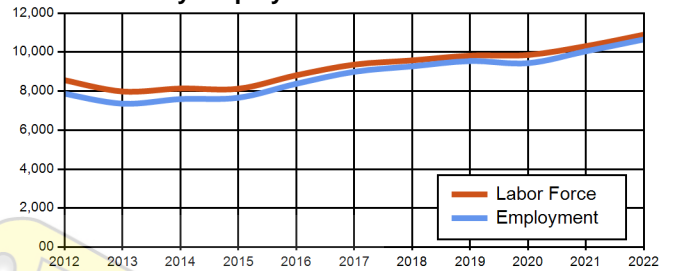

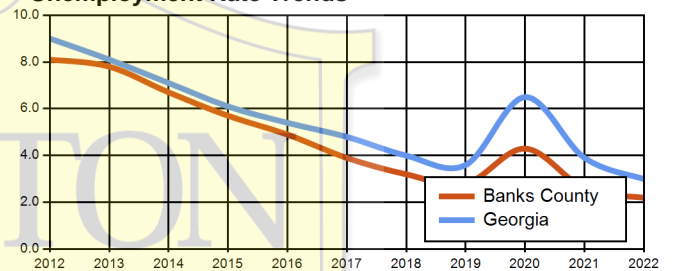

Unemployment Rate Trends

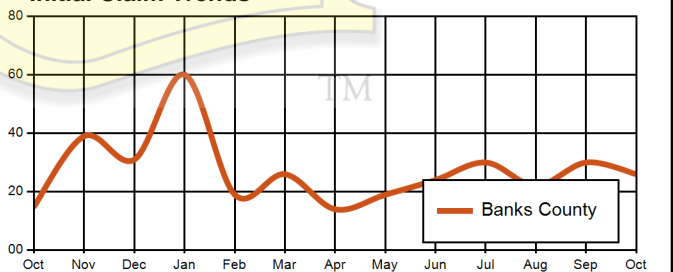

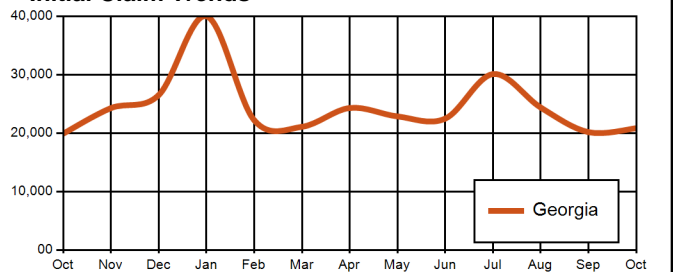

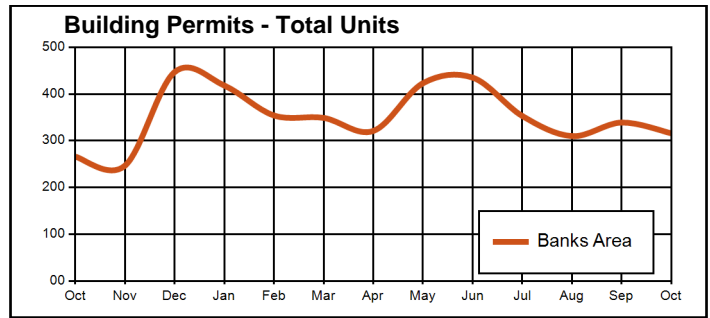

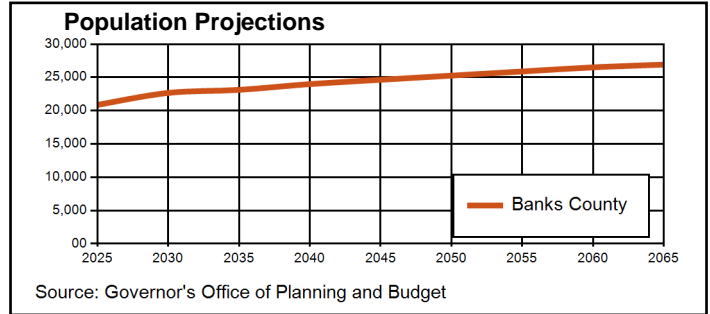

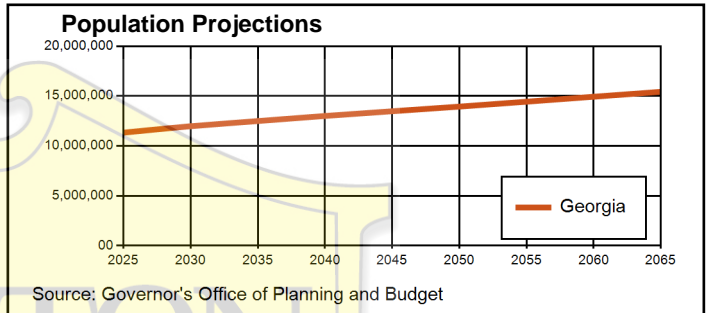

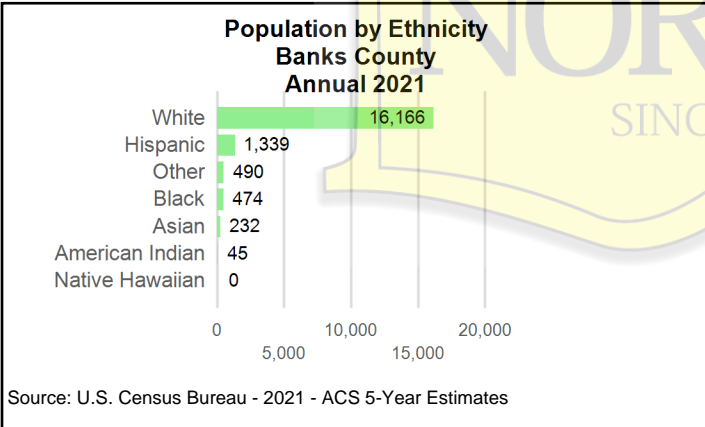

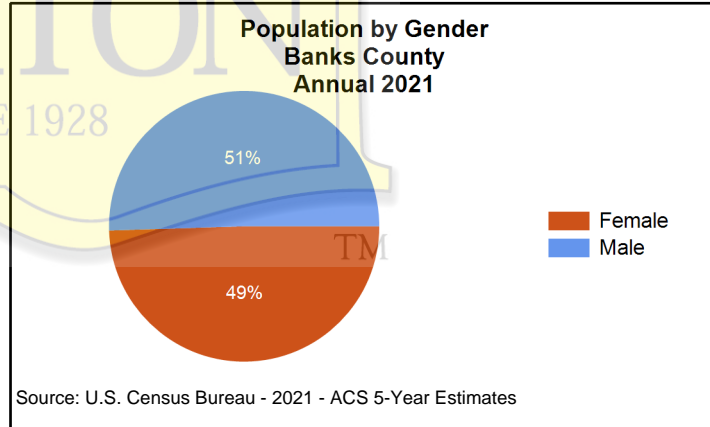

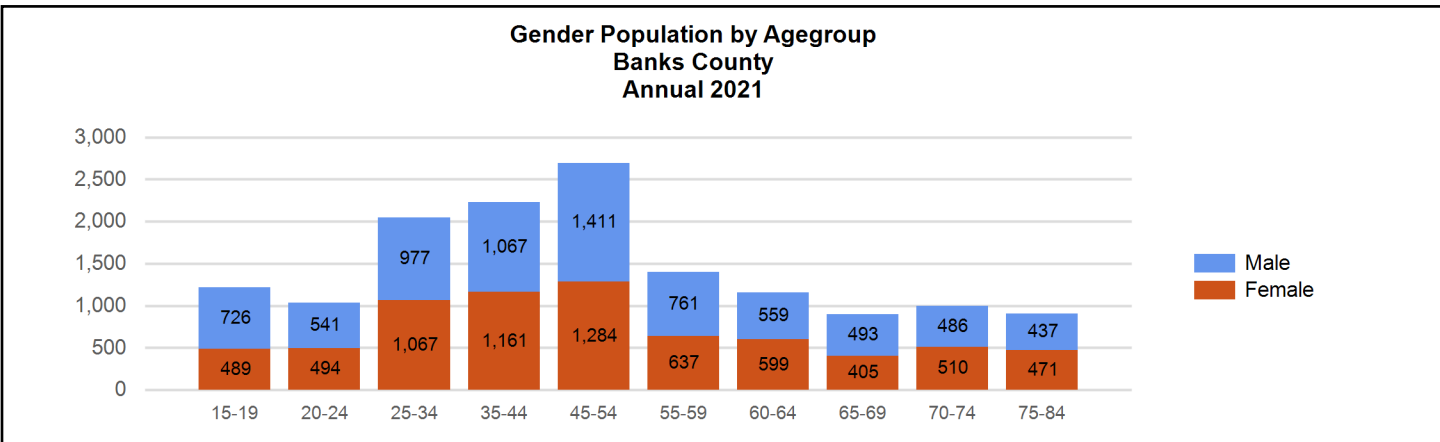

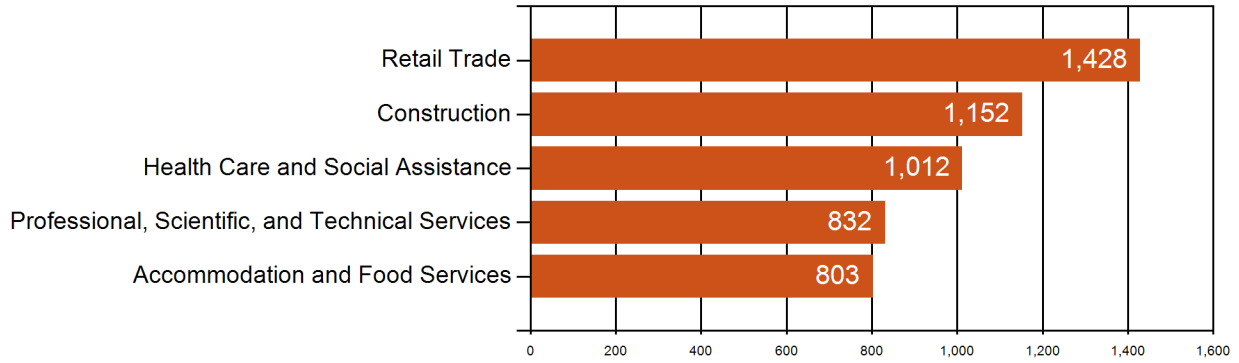

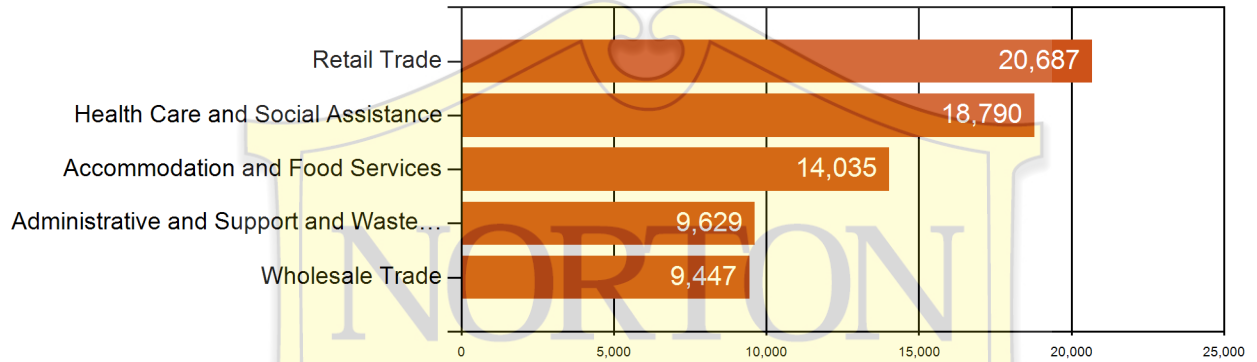

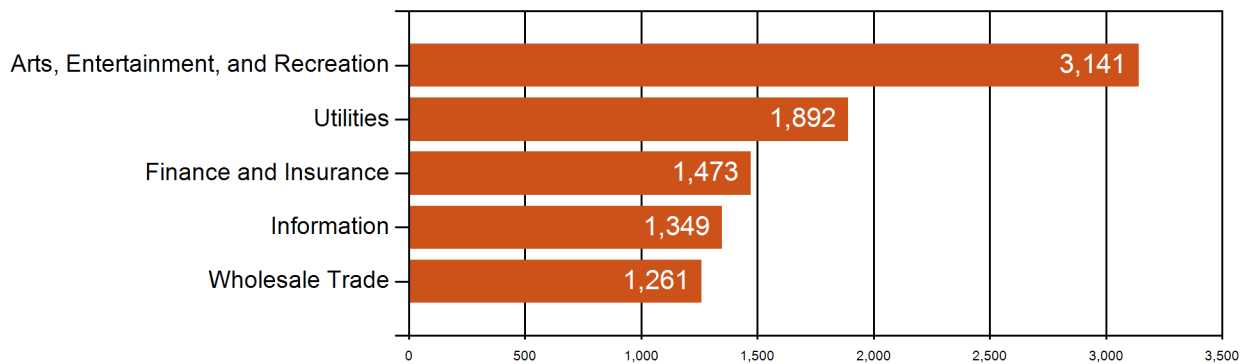
Top Industries by Firms
