

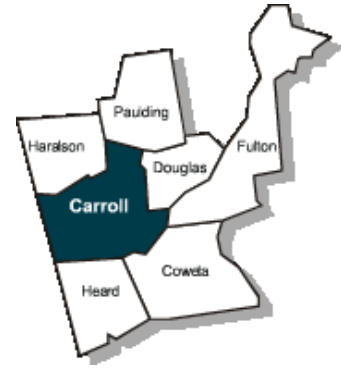

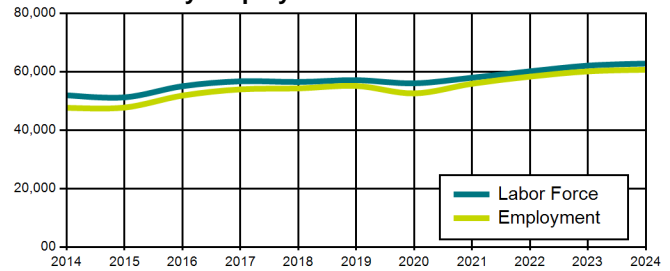

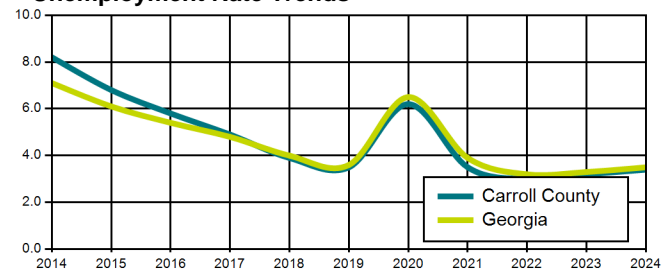

Unemployment Rate Trends

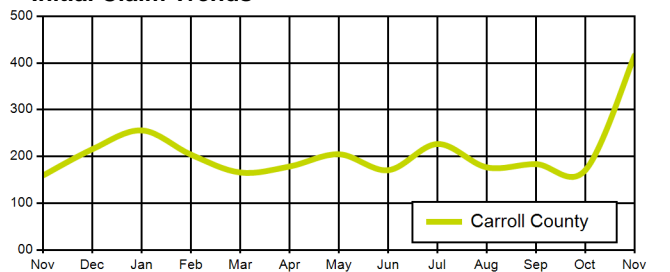

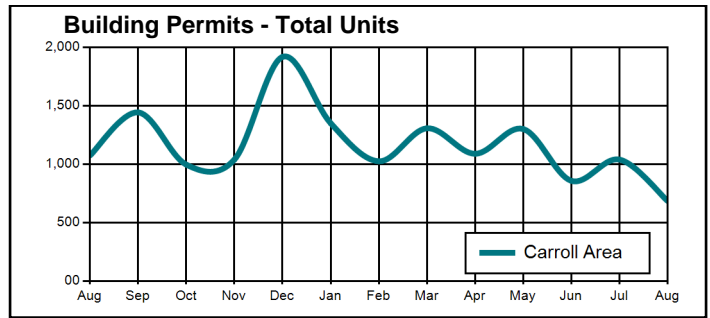

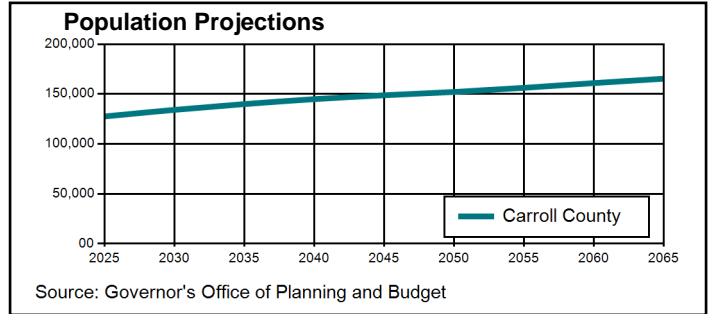

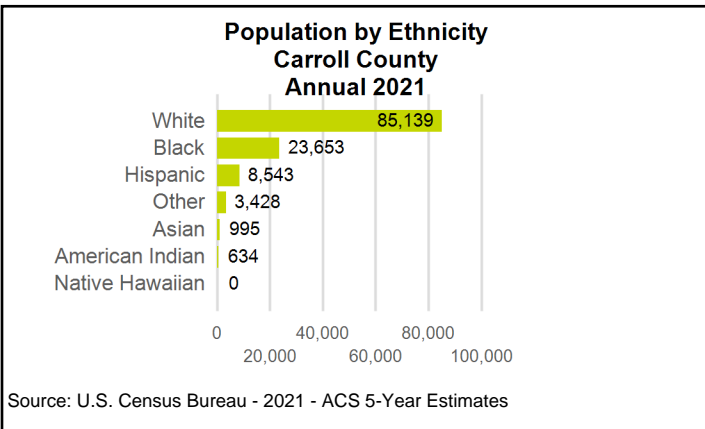

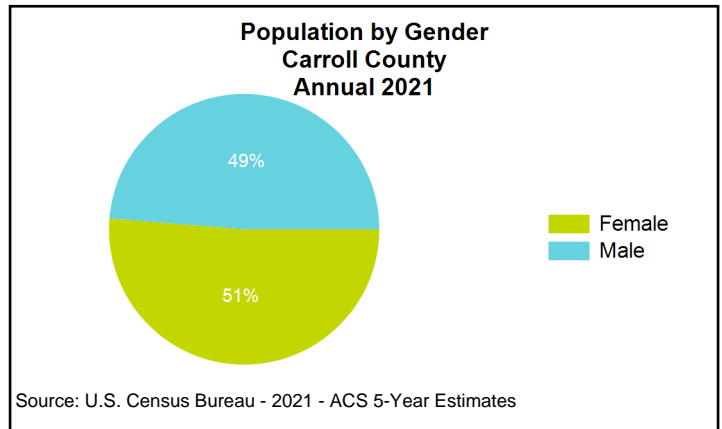

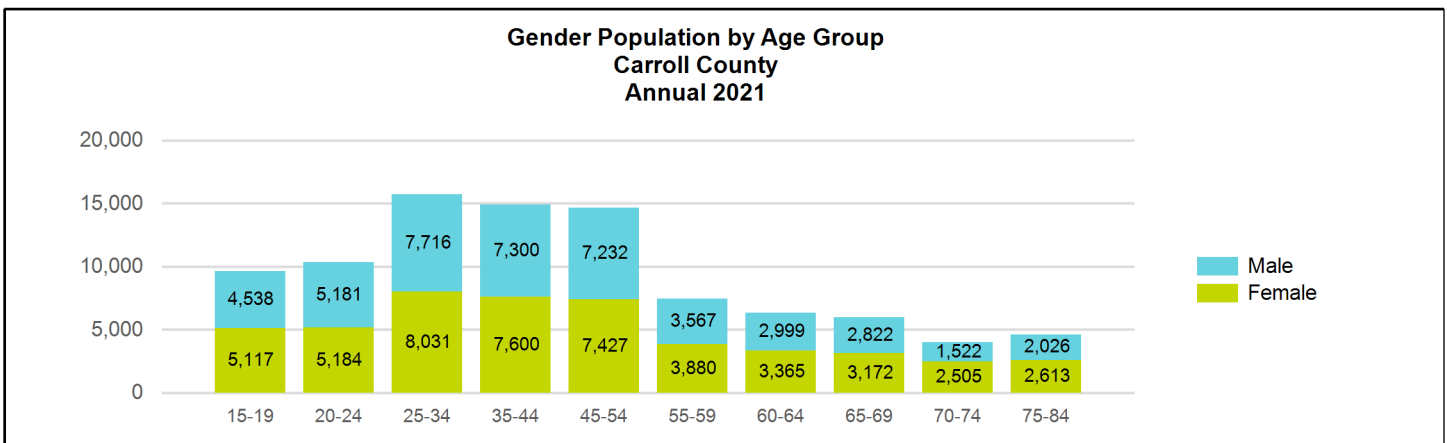

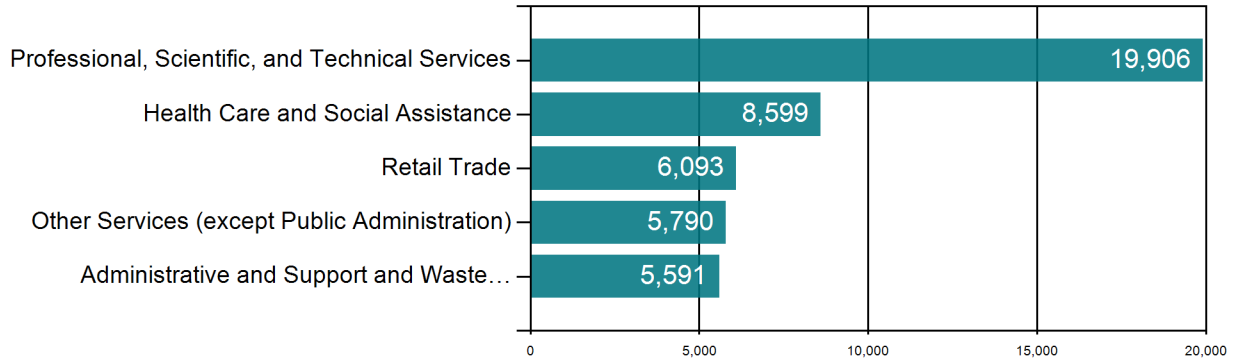

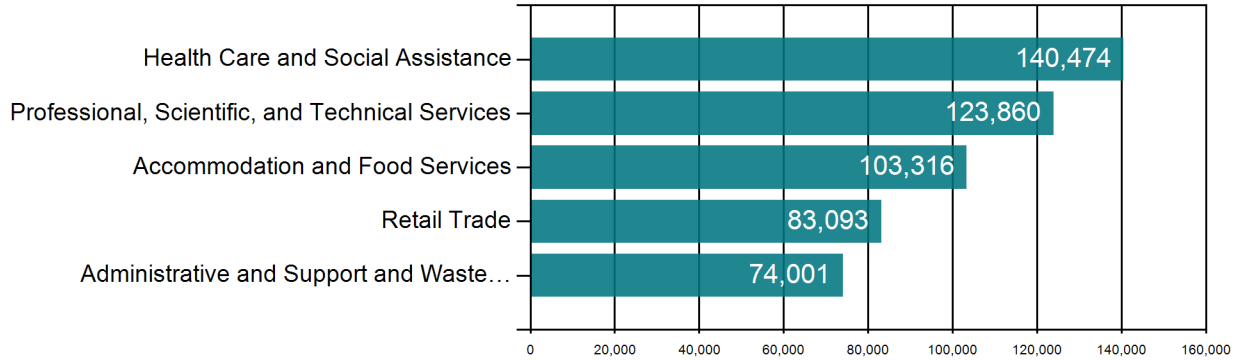
Top Industries - 2nd Quarter of 2025

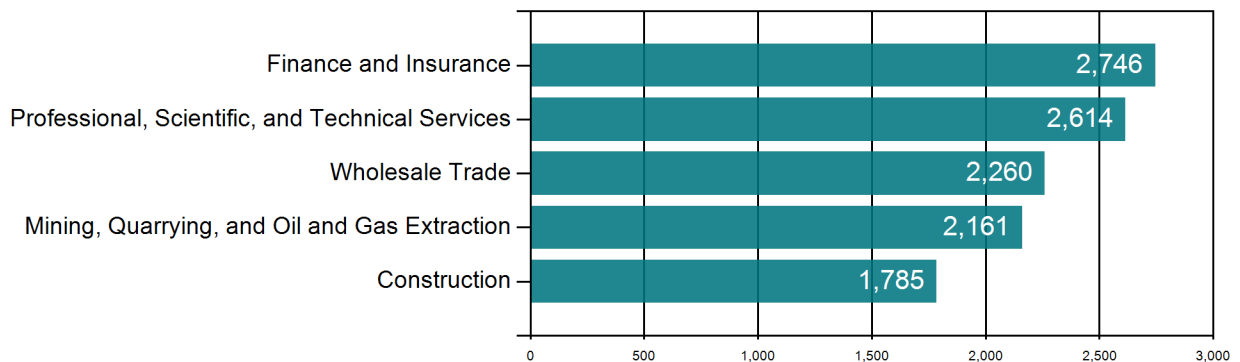
Top Industries by Firms
