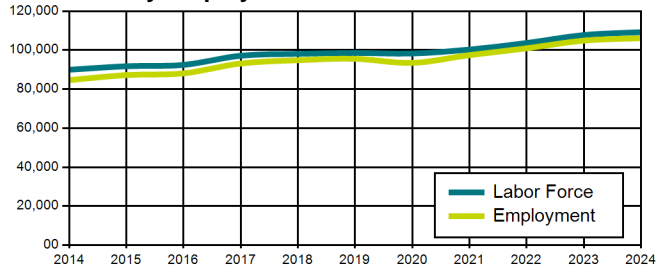

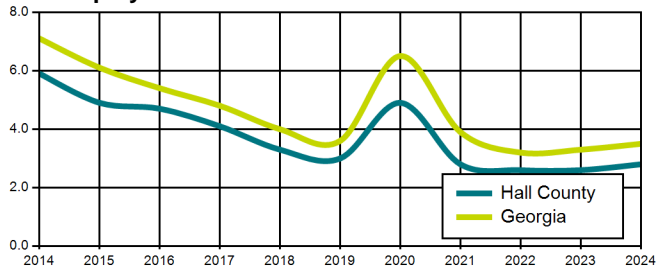

Unemployment Rate Trends



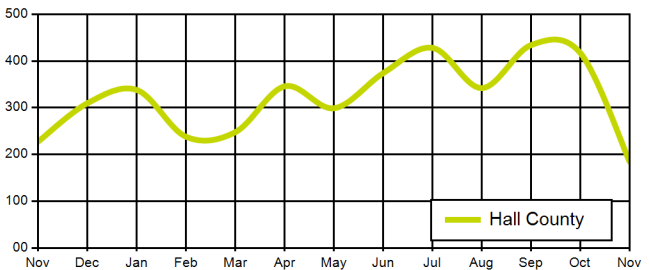

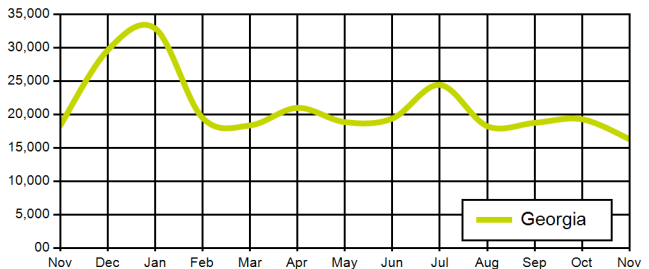

Initial Claim Trends

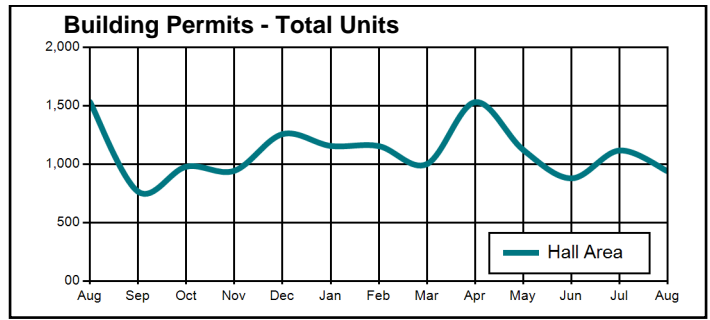

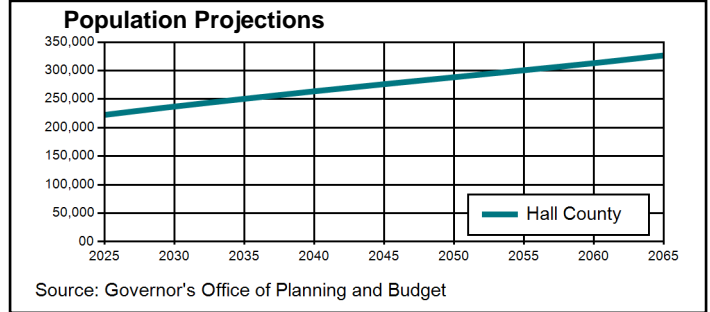

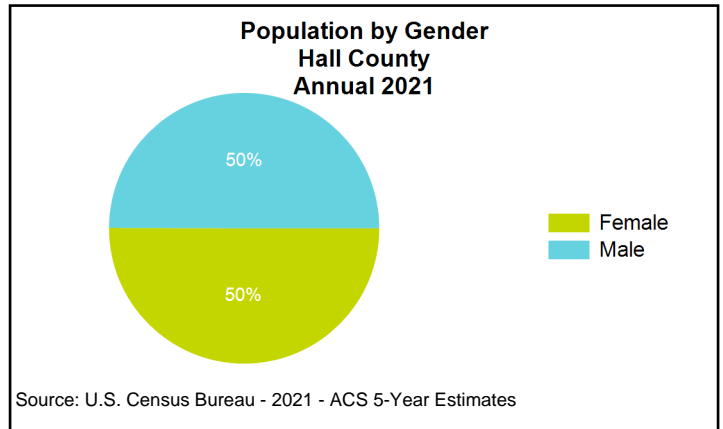

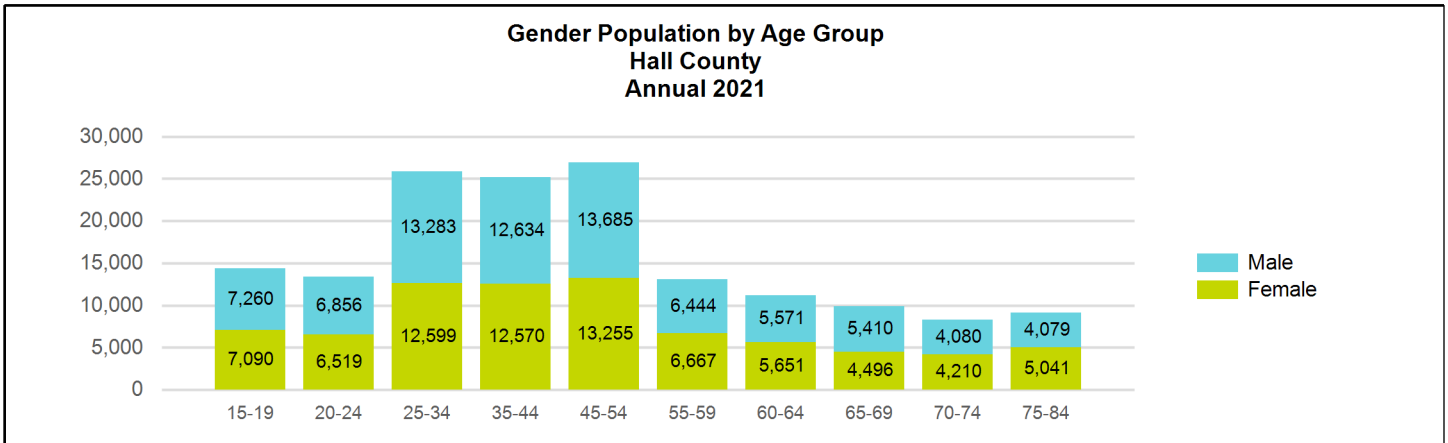

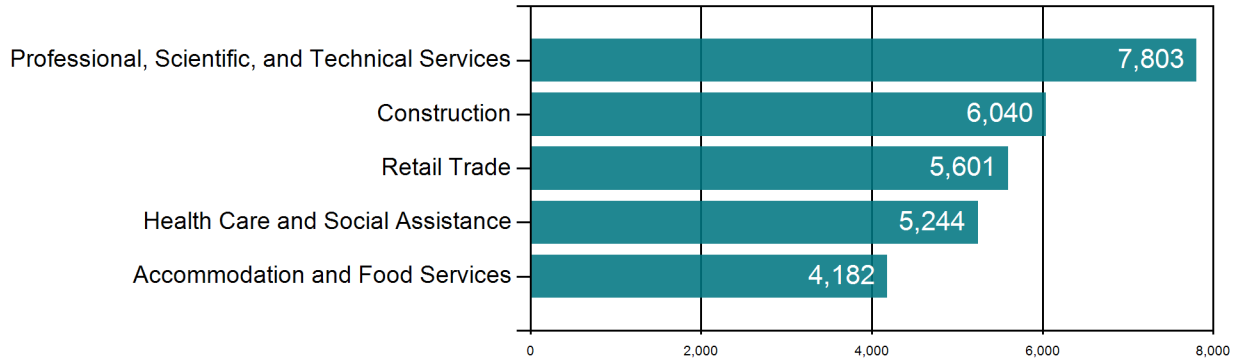

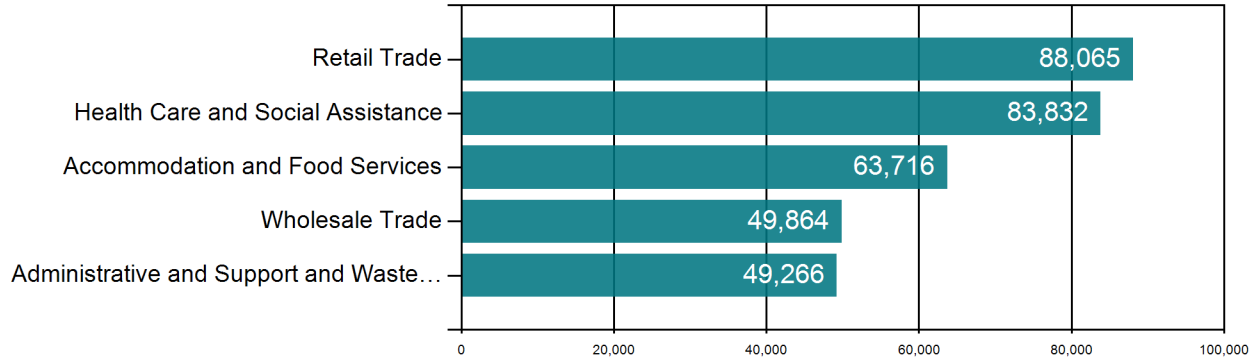

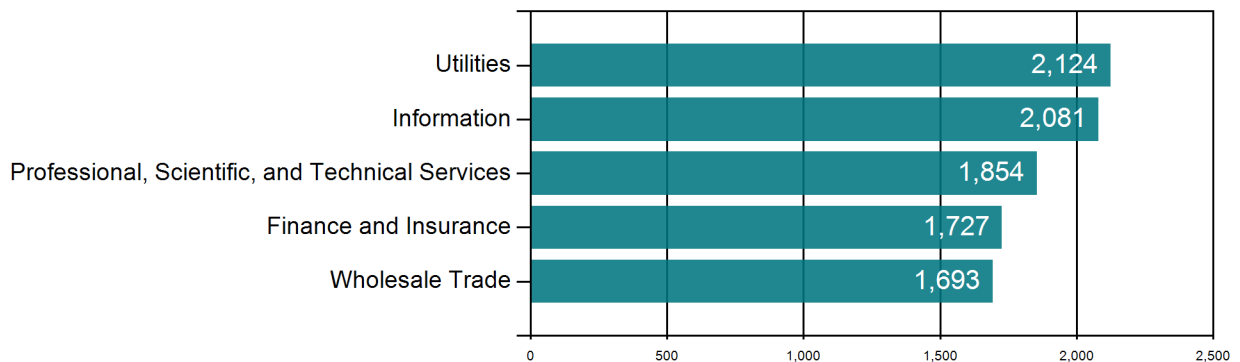
### Top Industries by Firms
